Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 22nd October 2023

Spiritual Reflection:

The Pharisees were intent on catching Jesus out, on trapping him and forcing him into a corner. More fool them, as we know that every time Jesus' response and wisdom put them to flight and exposed their evil motives. As the Gospels record, Jesus was the master at the apt reply, and both amazed and confounded with his ability to think on his feet and handle his verbal jousters.

His response in today's readings echoes down the centuries: 'give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's'. The Pharisees were ardent nationalists opposed to Roman rule, while the Herodians, as their name indicates, supported Roman rule. These opposing parties joined forces to trap Jesus. Their question - 'Is it right to pay the imperial tax to Caesar or not?' - was intended to catch him out. If he said 'No', the Herodians would report him to the Roman governor, and he risked being executed for treason. If he answered 'Yes', the Pharisees would denounce as a traitor to the Jewish nation. Oh, what wicked webs men do weave!

The common Roman coin, the denarius, had a picture of the emperor Tiberius on one side and on the other it carried the inscription 'Tiberius Caesar Augustus, son of the divine Augustus'. The coin was issued by Caesar and was used for paying tax to him. Jesus used it as a teaching aid to highlight that it was the duty of citizens to render to Caesar what was his and to God what was his, thus evading their trap and highlighting personal conscience. Each person must decide to render unto Caesar what Caesar is due and to God what God is due.



The same is true for us today. We render to the State (Caesar) what the State is due but also render to God what God is due. Sometimes, however, matters of conscience arise which make this compliance impossible, and we need to make a stand - for example, regarding our opposition to abortion

or assisted suicide. In fact, in these instances we resist the State, and both pray and work to change the minds and hearts to amend the law in the case of abortion but keep the present law in the case of assisted suicide.

Father, pour out the gift of your Spirit upon so us that I can walk in step with you and give an apt reply or wise counsel when challenged about my faith and my convictions.

My sincere and grateful thanks to all those parents who attended the First Holy Communion Meeting last Wednesday. It was good to see so many of you there. As I stated, this is one of the most important and serious times in your child's life as they prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist. The moral obligation to attend Sunday Mass has existed since the

beginning of Christianity. As Sunday is 'The Day of the Lord', the day Jesus rose from the dead. Our Sundays are sacred. This First Holy Communion Programme over these next months should take precedence over everything else; children will have a lifetime to play sports, but this one opportunity to prepare for the Sacraments. This is truly a wonderful opportunity for the whole family to celebrate the gift of our Catholic Faith. We truly do have so much to be thankful for to Almighty God, and the Eucharist is the great act of thanksgiving we share in week by week. This can be a real moment of grace for all! Let God who has begun this good work in us bring it to fulfilment!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - CATHOLIC SCHOOLS APPLICATIONS. If you are going to apply for a primary or secondary Catholic school with your child starting in September 2024, you <u>must</u> have first **registered** as a parishioner (see website).

For this year, Fr John and Fr Gary will be working together to see parents requesting Certificate of Catholic Practice forms.

Please note that:

a) Fr Gary will know those families who have been practising their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice.

- b) If you have not been practising your faith, please do not approach Fr John and Fr Gary for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as they will not be able to provide you with this document. Instead, apply directly to the Catholic school of choice.
- c) If you plan to send your daughter or son to St Helen's Infant School or the Ursuline School, you do not require a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- d) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practising your faith, please come to see Fr Gary and Fr John
- e) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have *not* been practising your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic school of your choice.
- f) Please note that Fr John and Fr Gary will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

Fr John and Fr Gary will be available only at the following times in the Cathedral to see parents who are *registered as parishioners* and who are practicing their faith by attending Sunday Mass. There is no need to make an appointment:

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service. Both Fr John & Fr Gary are Canon Lawyers and will be able to explain the whole process to you if you want to know more. Please contact Clergy House for an appointment.
