Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 8th October 2023

Spiritual Reflection:

Jesus taught love of enemies. He taught what he himself had to practice many times, particularly in relation to his dealings with the chief priests and Pharisees. The Parable of the Tenants addresses their rejection of him and alludes very much to the image of Israel as the vineyard found in the Old Testament.

At one level the parable isn't difficult to decipher. The owner of the vineyard is God; the tenant farmers represent the chief priests and Pharisees; the servants are the prophets of Israel, many of whom were rejected and mistreated appallingly; the son represents Jesus, whom the owner sends in the mistaken belief that 'They will respect my son' - but even he is murdered by the tenant farmers. The owner finally leases his vineyard to others 'who will give him his share of the crop at harvest time.'

Making a direct reference to Psalm 118, Jesus identifies himself as the stone rejected by the builders. The Christian community for which Matthew wrote this Gospel would have

found in this parable some light in understanding the destruction of the temple and the razing of Jerusalem by the Romans in AD70. It is important to decipher the parable at this level because Jesus spoke it into a historical reality.

However, as always with the Scriptures, there are many layers of meaning to uncover. The parable also brings to light the ever-present danger of clericalism and legalism which shuts away from the life of God and makes us harsh, cold and unyielding to others. It isn't just the clergy who fall prey to clericalism: we all can. The remedy or antidote is learning to be attentive to what God is saying to us, in the Scriptures, in our prayer and in the inner sanctuary of our conscience.

One of the hallmarks that we are living by the spirit of the Pharisees is our inability to listen to the other side. St Augustine said: 'Hear the other side.' In other words, be open to what God is doing in the lives of those around us. The Holy Spirit works within us to create the spirit of meekness, which is openness to what God is doing in our midst - in other people's lives but also in the world around us.

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Last Sunday I returned to my former parish, St Edmund's, Loughton for my final Mass of Thanksgiving, and like Fr. Martin's it was packed with parishioners whom I had served for twenty-one years. It was lovely to see the folks once again, but as I shared with them, as a priest it is part of our lives to eventually move on to pastures new. It's probably one of the hardest aspects of the priesthood, but we all know it will happen sooner or later. As my dear old mum used to say, 'nothing stays the same'! I have embraced whole heartedly this move to the Cathedral Parish, and as I said last week I am officially, 'now yours'! One of the greatest joys of the priesthood is to live amidst his people, and get to know them

and serve them, this is where most priests find the greatest happiness - with the people.

We learn many lessons in life, and after forty-two years of priesthood, I truly believe that every priest needs three things to serve effectively as a minister, the first is kindness, the second is kindness and the third is kindness. So often in life people can be accused of being unkind. You won't often find the word 'kindness' in many of the Vatican Documents, but what you do find are the words 'pastoral charity', and effectively speaking this is demonstrated through acts of kindness. To reach out to someone in need, or someone who is suffering, are acts of kindness. They cost nothing but our time, but they can be life changing in so many ways. What I am sharing with you here in these few words is the sum of a lifetime of searching, discovering, learning, and putting into action the virtues of kindness and love.

If you think about it, Jesus was raised in the school of kindness by Mary & Joseph. He is the model of all kindness. What attracted so many people to the Lord? Not just his miracles, preaching and teaching, but his acts of kindness to so many. Where do we find the Lord in the Sacred Scriptures, usually with the poor, the outcasts, those who lived on the periphery of society, he showed them God's unconditional and loving kindness. Hopefully we all try to emulate the Lord in his love & kindness in our own lives of faith.
