Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 15th October 2023

Spiritual Reflection:

Jesus spoke and taught this parable in a specific time, place and historical context, and it was relevant to that specific time, place and historical context. It addressed the Jewish people's reaction to his presence among them, to his teaching



and the claims that he was making. Given this context and understanding we could be forgiven for thinking, 'What on earth does this parable have to do with my life here and now, in October 2023?' We can be sure that God in his infinite wisdom will reply: 'Good question.'

The parable, because it is the inspired word of God, transcends historical context and speaks into our twenty-first century lives. A key to its meaning is found in studying, praying, and reflecting on the 'mind-sets', 'attitudes' and 'ways of thinking' prevalent in those who rejected the invitation to the Wedding party, but also the 'attitude', 'mind-set' and 'way of thinking' of the king in the parable. It doesn't take a rocket scientist or even a theologian to understand that whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we are attending the wedding banquet. However, we can be like the invited guests who

refused the invitation because they were too busy about their own business. When we come to celebrate the Eucharist, our minds and hearts can be preoccupied so that we pay no attention to the great feast of grace to which we are invited. We are present but absent at the same time!

Recovering the sense of Eucharistic awe is an important part of our ongoing conversion and interior renewal. Understanding that we are guests at the Eucharistic banquet, and that this celebration is the 'source and summit' of our faith and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet towards which we journey on pilgrimage is vital in living our faith today. We will then grasp that God's invitation of love, mercy and forgiveness is extended to every human person: rich, poor, righteous, unrighteous, regardless of gender, race or social class. We don't want to be among those who are invited but not chosen because we failed to grasp the blessing and grace of God in our lives, available to us through the sacraments of the Church.

Lord, thank you for the invitation to the Eucharistic banquet. Deeper within me a sense of awe, wonder and amazement, gratitude, and praise for the sublime gift of your Body & Blood, through which I am nourished spiritually, for this life, and the life to come.

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1324-1327), states that, "The Eucharist is "the source and summit" of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our pasche.

The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination

both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit.

Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life when God will be all in all. In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.

Please note that:

- a) Fr Gary will know those families who have been practising their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- b) If you have not been practising your faith, please do not approach Fr John and Fr Gary for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as they will not be able to provide you with this document. Instead, apply directly to the Catholic school of choice.
- c) If you plan to send your daughter or son to St Helen's Infant School or the Ursuline School, you do not require a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- d) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practising your faith, please come to see Fr Gary and Fr John
- e) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have *not* been practising your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic school of your choice.

f) Please note that Fr John and Fr Gary will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.
