Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 5th November 2023

Spiritual Reflection:

Our Sunday reading is once again out of sequence and, in fact, from a different Gospel. But while the emphases in the four Gospels may be different, their message is the same. We will discover in today our Matthew reading the same invitation to live as a new creation, to live from the heart, in contrast with the behaviour manifested by the Scribes and Pharisees.

This time, Jesus focuses on the way that the authorities' behaviour is motivated by a desire to draw attention to themselves, rather than leading others to the recognition and the worship of God. The authorities, says Jesus, occupy the chair of Moses. In other words, it is their responsibility - and right - to teach the ways of God, based on the Word of God. Jesus recommends listening to their word - because it is God's word. However, he advises not to imitate their behaviour, because it is not of God. Their actions, and many of their words of argument (as opposed to teaching of the Word of God), arise out of their own fallen nature, self-will and self-justification.

Even the way they liked to be address, as 'Rabbi' or 'Teacher', Jesus implies, has turned the title into a self-evaluation, rather

than a description of service or servanthood. There is nothing wrong with the titles: the problem is our fallen nature, which takes something good and twists it into something self-serving.



Ultimately, this teaching and our own familiarity with the very same tendencies when it comes to our observance of our faith, lead us to cry out to the Lord to make of us a new creation like himself.

Without this transforming injection of new life (the life of the Spirit), our actions can often be reduced to the same self-serving lip-service. As a result, we can miss out on the enormous privilege of being courted among God's children living in his world and within his time - set free from the drag of our fallen human nature, and set free to be of service to others, even simply by example. But lip-service convinces no one.

Rather than hungering for self-righteousness and self-justification, let us hunger for the new life that Jesus came to bring. It is Jesus who now occupies Moses' chair. In fact, it turns out that it was always Jesus' chair (of authority) - Moses was merely keeping it warm.

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

In this month of November, the Church affords us the opportunity to pray in a very special way for the Faithful Departed - Holy Souls. At our beautiful Mass for the deceased last Thursday, we offered up to God all our deceased loved ones in a very special way and asked the Lord to embrace them into his loving embrace and eternity.

We are encouraged to pray for all the deceased, and there are many ways that we can do this. 1) Pray a Novena to the Holy Souls. 2) Offer your Holy Communion for the souls in Purgatory. 3) Have Masses offered for your departed loved one, and especially on their anniversaries. 4) Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet for the intention of the Holy Souls. 5) Eucharistic

Adoration: visit the Blessed Sacrament to make acts of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on behalf of those in purgatory. 6) Sacrifices: practice small acts of self-denial throughout the day and offer them for the Holy Souls. 7) Give alms: The giving of material assistance to the poor has always been considered a penance that can be offered for the Holy Souls. "For almsgiving saves from death and purges all sin" (Tobit 12:9). 8) Ask for the intercession of saints who were known to be great friends of the Holy Souls during their lifetime to join you in prayer for the faithful departed: St. Nicholas of Tolentino, St. Gertrude the Great, St. Catherine of Genoa, St. Padre Pio, St. Philip Neri, St. John Macías, St. Faustina Kowalska, St. Joseph, Our Lady, and others. 9) When passing by a cemetery: Pray the short Eternal Rest prayer: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen." 10) Pray to earn indulgences for the holy souls: On all the days from November 1 to November 8, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed (standard requirements for indulgences apply*). Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the Eternal Rest prayer:

* The usual conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence apply, including sacramental confession, the reception of Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, as well as complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin.

At the end of our Weekday masses Monday - Saturday, we will pray a Decade of Rosary and Prayers for the deceased and Repose of All Holy Souls. Please make a very special effort to join us during this special Month of Holy Souls.

PATRICK'S CEMETERY There will a be a Special Mass at St. Patrick's Cemetery, Langthorne Rd, Leytonstone, London E11 4HL, in this month of Holy Souls on Monday 13th November at 11.30 a.m. For those parishioners who have deceased family and friends buried at St. Patrick's this is a wonderful opportunity to

remember them through the Holy Mass. Pope Francis said there is no greater way to honour our deceased loved ones than through the Eucharist.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

APPLICATIONS. If you are going to apply for a primary or secondary Catholic school with your child starting in September

2024, you <u>must</u> have first **registered** as a parishioner (see website).

For this year, Fr John and Fr Gary will be working together to see parents requesting Certificate of Catholic Practice forms.

Please note that:

- a) Fr Gary will know those families who have been practising their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- b) If you have not been practising your faith, please do not approach Fr John and Fr Gary for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as they will not be able to provide you with this document. Instead, apply directly to the Catholic school of choice.
- If you plan to send your daughter or son to St Helen's Infant School, you do not require a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- d) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practising your faith, please come to see Fr Gary and Fr John
- e) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have *not* been practising your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic school of your choice.
- f) Please note that Fr John and Fr Gary will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

Fr John and Fr Gary will be available only at the following times in the Cathedral to see parents who are *registered as parishioners* and who are practicing their faith by attending Sunday Mass. There is no need to make an appointment:

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service. Both Fr John & Fr Gary are Canon Lawyers and will be able to explain the whole process to you if you want to know more. Please contact Clergy House for an appointment.
