## SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING (A) Sunday 26th November 2023

#### Spiritual Reflection:

When Christ comes again, he will judge us on whether or not we have kept the Ten Commandments, that is, on our obedience to God's law. He will also judge us on whether we followed his commandment to love our neighbour: 'This I command you, to love one another', that is, on our treatment of others. This judgement is perhaps a more searching one. Christ wishes to reward us for the good we have done. He has no desire to punish us or exclude us from heaven.

Jesus laid down his life for us. He loves us unconditionally. It is critical that we grasp the depth of his love for us so that we are not paralysed with fear or by the prospect of his judgement. It is vital that we contemplate God's love towards us, recognising his mercy and kindness. In this way we will grow in our knowledge and experience of God's love. Out of love for us God promised: 'I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the cripple, and I will strengthen



the weak, and the fat and the strong I will watch over; I will feed them in justice'. He fulfilled his promise when he sent Jesus as our Shepherd; 'The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want.' Jesus brings us back to the Father, bandages up our wounds, strengthens us through the gift of his body and blood and protects us from Satan's ferocious attacks. We live in Jesus' love. This enables us to love others as he has loved us.



Matthew lists some practical ways of loving others: feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and those in prison. Fundamentally, loving others is taking care of them and serving their

needs - being a blessing to them in any way that we can. This is not difficult for our love for others flows out of a grateful heart, a heart that knows it is loved. Reflect on the many ways that God shows his love for you. Let this love fill your heart. Then let his love overflow to others.

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

"Little acts of love, kindness and faith add up to holiness" Pope Francis speaks very openly about the road to holiness. Holiness is something much greater, much more profound than looking like an image on a holy card, he said. "It is living with love and offering your own Christian witness in your daily tasks." Pope Francis said, "a great gift" of the Second Vatican Council was the recovery of the notion of "the church as communion," a community formed by people who "have equal dignity and have the same vocation to holiness" by virtue of their baptism. "To be saints, one does not necessarily have to be a bishop, priest or religious, no," he said. "We are all called to become saints." "Many times, we are tempted to think that holiness is reserved only for those who have the possibility of detaching themselves from ordinary concerns so they can dedicate themselves exclusively to prayer," he said. "But that's not true." Holiness, the pope said, is a gift God offers to everyone and a response to his grace. It is the result of hundreds of little steps and gestures each day. And they will be different for each person depending on the circumstances of one's life.

Consecrated men and women become saints by living their vows with joy, he said. Married people become saints by loving

and taking care of their husband or wife. Single Catholics become saints "doing their work with honesty and competence and offering their time to serve their brothers and sisters." "In a factory or an office, in the marketplace or in the home", he said, "God communicates with the faithful and gives them the grace to be holy." Parents and grandparents are taking a step toward holiness when they patiently listen to their children or grandchildren and when they enthusiastically teach them "to know and follow Jesus," the pope said, "Holiness comes through the exercise of patience" with children, especially when you are tired, he added. People who do volunteer work take a step toward holiness every time they demonstrate God's love for and closeness to someone who is suffering, he said. On Sundays, going to Mass and receiving communion - sometimes adding a good confession that cleans us up a bit - that is a step toward holiness the Pope said.

"Be bearers of holiness. Always, e.g., in your home, on the streets, at work and in the church." This message is not exclusive; it's there for all of us. Holiness is not beyond our grasp; it's there offered to us by the Lord; how we respond is ultimately up to us!

WORLD YOUTH SUNDAY is being celebrated on this Feast of Christ the King (25th / 26th November). On this weekend the Church across the whole world is celebrating young people, the theme chosen by Pope Francis is "Come and see!" He is reminding young people that Jesus never closes the door and



young people that Jesus never closes the door and that all are welcome. We hope that the Brentwood Catholic Youth Service offers young people the opportunity to "come and see" through our events, pilgrimages, and retreats.

There will be a short talk at each of our masses this weekend on the work of the Diocesan Youth Service, also a retiring collection.

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes

to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service.
