REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Spiritual Reflection

The Parable of the Ten Virgins or Bridesmaids only occurs in St. Matthew's Gospel. Unlike some of the other parables (the parable of the Sower, for example) Jesus offers no interpretation: rather we are invited to plumb its depths, mine its treasure and drill deep for its hidden meaning. We can skim the surface, even paddle a little in its light, but to truly enter the mystery it unlocks we need time, resources (commentaries, concordances, study aids), and most of all, prayer, and the desire to immerse ourselves in the Scriptures.

The virgins are clearly believers - some are wise, some are foolish, but all believe in God and Christ. We don't often realise it, but like the virgins all believers are awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom in glory at the end of time when we will wrap up human history. The second coming, the Parousia, is a central doctrine of our faith, as are the Incarnation, the Cross, and the Resurrection.



For some, this thirst for Christ's return lives in them as a profound truth of faith: they groan and long for this final and definitive event in history - the culmination of salvation history.

This is the blessed hope of the Church and, whether we realise it or not, the prayer of cry from Jesus' return is at the heart of every Eucharistic celebration. We are a people who rejoice in Jesus' first coming but also long for and prepare for his second.

All the virgins had lamps and all the virgins fell asleep. The sleep is the sleep of sin, to which we all succumb because faith is lived through the struggle with sin, darkness, and confusion. The difference was that the wise virgins had come prepared with an extra jar of oil in case their lamps went out. We need a grace of revelation to understand the meaning of the jars of oil they took with them, but perhaps this extra provision of oil relates to faith in the return of the King, the Bridegroom. They couldn't share this oil, just as we can't share our hope in Christ's return - this truth burning in our hearts is the gift of the Spirit.

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

TEACHING ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST The Second Vatican Council document Lumen gentium states: Since the Christian life is essentially a spiritual life; we might say as well that the Eucharist is the "source and summit of Christian spirituality" too. To the pious Catholic, that proposition may seem obvious enough, even if he does not quite understand why. Intuitively, he knows that the spiritual life means using every means available to grow closer to Christ. And he knows that Christ Himself is present in the Eucharist in the most sublime manner. It makes sense, then, that the Eucharist should be central to the spiritual life of a Catholic. But what the devout soul knows about the Eucharist intuitively should, where possible, become better known and more deeply experienced through systematic reflection on the Church's Eucharistic doctrine. The better we understand the

Eucharist's role in Christian spirituality, the better we will be able to love Christ present in the Eucharist.

These two dimensions of the Eucharist - being both the "source" and "summit" of Christian spirituality - reveal how the Eucharist, being Christ Himself, brings God and man together in a saving dialogue, a mutually giving and receiving relationship. In short, in a covenant of love. The Eucharist is at once the Father's gift of Himself in Christ to us and, through Christ, our offering of Christ and, with Him, of ourselves - our minds and hearts, our daily lives - to the Father. As the source of Christian spirituality, the Eucharist revealed that our salvation begins with God, not ourselves. God offers Himself to man in Christ first. At the same time, as the summit of Christian spirituality, the Eucharist is man's supreme, grace-enabled, freely given offering of himself back to God through Jesus Christ, our high priest, by the power of the Holy Spirit. The union or intimate, personal fellowship between God and man realized through God's gift of Himself to man and man's faithful response, we call communion.

Put in the traditional language of the Christian spirituality, we say that this communion with God is brought about by grace and lived out in the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity. Because the sacraments are instruments of grace and means of growth in the theological virtues, we can say that Christian spirituality entails what Pope John Paul II called a "sacramental style of life." It involves using the sacraments to grow in the spiritual life. And because the greatest of sacraments is the Eucharist, Christian spirituality is above all Eucharistic: coming from the Eucharist as its source and directed to it as its summit or zenith.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - CATHOLIC SCHOOLS APPLICATIONS. If you are going to apply for a primary or secondary Catholic school with your child starting in September 2024, you <u>must</u> have first **registered** as a parishioner (see website). For this year, Fr John and Fr Gary will be working

together to see parents requesting Certificate of Catholic Practice forms.

Please note that:

- a) Fr Gary will know those families who have been practising their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- b) If you have not been practising your faith, please do not approach Fr John and Fr Gary for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as they will not be able to provide you with this document. Instead, apply directly to the Catholic school of choice.
- If you plan to send your daughter or son to St Helen's Infant School, you do not require a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- d) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practising your faith, please come to see Fr Gary and Fr John
- e) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have *not* been practising your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic school of your choice.
- f) Please note that Fr John and Fr Gary will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service. Both Fr John & Fr Gary are Canon Lawyers and will be able to explain the whole process to you if you want to know more. Please contact Clergy House for an appointment.
