DID YOU KNOW there is a traditional house blessing for Epiphany? It is sometimes known as 'chalking the doors' and is very simple. Take some chalk (ideally blessed by a priest on the Feast of the Epiphany) and write above the entrance of your

home: 20 + C + M + B + 24. The letters represent the initials of the Magi - Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar - who came to visit Jesus in the place where he was born. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat, which translates as "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "24" at the end mark the year. In this blessing we ask Christ to stay within our homes all year. Chalk will be blessed during the 930 Mass on Sunday 7th January and will be available to take away.

Fr John and Fr Gary are always pleased to be invited to bless your home for you. It is a beautiful way to mark the start of a new year, or the beginning of a new part of life in a new place.
