# FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT (B) Sunday 3rd December 2023

## Spiritual Reflection:

Our English word Advent derives from the Latin word adventus, which means 'coming'. Through the liturgy of the Church, in prayer and the reading of the Scriptures, the ancient expectancy for the coming of the Messiah is made real and present in



our lives and hearts. Each Advent celebration holds out to us the opportunity to share in the drama of Christ's first coming and at the same time renews within us an ardent desire for his second.

Christmas invites us all to rediscover the child within and to become a child in relation to God, for this is the condition of entering the kingdom of heaven. This means humbling ourselves before the Christmas mystery: through the poverty of the manger the glory of God was revealed, and simple shepherds were the first witnesses. This is why we never tire of celebrating the birth of the Saviour when God became man, revealing himself as 'God with us', Emmanuel.

For years CS Lewis, who was a professor of English Literature at Oxford University, rejected the Christian message

because he believed it to be one among many myths for the ancient world. However, through conversations he had with JRR Tolkien, himself a professor of English Language, and the work of the Holy Spirit, he came to see that the Christian message and especially the birth of Christ was a 'true myth' - both historically and by virtue of the fact that it revealed God's plan of salvation.



The giving and receiving of gifts are a wonderful and fun part of Christmas. The giving of Christmas gifts mirrors God's giving of the greatest gift of all; the gift of Jesus, through whom we are born again and become children of God. The marvellous exchange, this indescribable

gift, is the meaning of Christmas and the source of our joy and peace: 'For unto us a child is born, to us a son is given.' The beautiful words of Antiphon 1, from January 1st Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God Evening Prayer, captures this truth: 'O marvellous exchange! Man's Creator has become man, born of the Virgin. We have been made sharers in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share our humanity.'

## MARANATHA, COME LORD JESUS!

My Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

As the Holy Season of Advent begins once again, we direct our thoughts and minds to our spiritual preparation for Christmas. We have nearly four weeks to prepare ourselves, our families and our community for the greatest event in the



whole of human history; at a moment in time God deigned to share our human condition in the Christ-child of Bethlehem. The Incarnation was the climax of God's plan of Salvation for the whole of humanity. The innocence of the child born in Bethlehem will be overshadowed by the Cross, which will

become the means whereby God would redeem the world through his Son, Jesus Christ. As we enter the special season once again, we are reminded of our part in God's on-going invitation to share in his life through Jesus Christ. The true meaning of Advent can often be lost in the commercial and materialistic aspect of the season, but it's our duty to keep our

eyes focused on the Lord.

This is truly a wonderful time of preparation. Parents, I would ask you to explain to your children the whole Nativity Story; your greatest source of reference is the Infancy Narratives at the beginning of St. Matthew &

Luke's Gospels. If you read these to your children over the next few weeks, this will be a truly wonderful preparation for Christmas. We also have little 'Walk with Me' booklets at £1 each. These are little daily reflections for the whole of Advent leading us to Christmas. Ladies you can keep them in your handbags, and gents you can put them in your inside pocket. Daily prayer, even just a little pious prayer, such as, 'Come Lord Jesus' or 'Jesus, I love you', can really help in looking forward to Jesus' birth once again into our lives this Christmas.

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service. Both Fr John & Fr Gary are Canon Lawyers and will be able to explain the whole process to you if you want to know more. Please contact Clergy House for an appointment.
