SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (B) Sunday 25th February 2024

Spiritual Reflection:

Peter's witnessing of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor wasn't sufficient to enable him to withstand the overwhelming doubt and confusion he experienced when, gripped by fear and cowardice in the midst of the events of Jesus' Passion and death, he denied



Christ three times. This foretaste of the kingdom high on Mount Tabor couldn't help him resist the temptation to betray his Lord. We do know that once he turned back, he would strengthen the believers with his witness of what occurred on the mountain.

Peter bears eloquent testimony to the Transfiguration event, proclaiming that it was when he saw first-hand Jesus' majesty and glory and heard the Father's voice say: 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.' For a moment Jesus disclosed his divine glory and revealed that the way of the cross is the way into God's glory. First the shame (the cross), then the glory (resurrection). Just before Jesus began his public ministry, he was baptised, and the Blessed Trinity was revealed. Just before he entered his Passover, he was transfigured, and the Blessed Trinity was revealed. As St. Thomas Aquinas said: 'The Father in the voice, the Son in the man Jesus, the Spirit in the shining cloud.'

Through baptism we are immersed into the death and resurrection of Jesus and the blessed life of the Trinity. Our dignity and our destiny rest on the living hope that at the coming of Jesus and the resurrection of the dead we will be raised up body and soul, just as Jesus was raised up body and soul. The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of the resurrection of life to come, but first we too must embrace the cross of suffering.

The walk of holiness means that day after day we are being transformed, so that one day, like Jesus on Mount Tabor, we will reflect the glory of Christ, and this life will make us shine resplendently. Lent is a time for us to taste and see that the Lord is good, and part of this means glimpsing, rather as the disciples did, the future glory of being a son and daughter of God.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we commence this second week of our holy Lenten Season; ask yourself have you remained faithful to the resolutions that you made on Ash Wednesday? It's so easy to fall by the wayside very quickly. But that doesn't



mean that we have to give up. Lent can be a truly positive experience; a time of growth and understanding of the Lord Jesus. We have to remember where this journey is leading us; ultimately to the greatest event this world has ever known. Jesus Christ, who died on Good Friday, rose triumphantly on Easter Day. Sin and death was conquered; and the Lord invites each one of us personally to share in that New Life, which we call our Catholic Faith. How we prepare for that is up to us. No one can do this for us. Prayer, Fasting, Works of Charity are all well and good, but if there is no real intention behind them it becomes only lipservice. Conversion-Change of Heart is what the Lord calls each one of us to.

SET YOURSELF LITTLE TARGETS Morning and Evening Prayers; Reading a passesge from the Bible; Attending an additional Mass during the week; Attending Holy Hour; Praying the Stations of the Cross; Praying the Rosary, or even a decade of the Rosary each day; reading a chapter of a spiritual book. But please don't let this Lent pass you by.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS The traditional devotion during the Lenten Season. I would encourage all our parishioners to attend the Stations of the Cross on **Fridays at 7.00 p.m.** This beautiful devotion follows the last journey made by Jesus on Good Friday to Calvary.



LENTEN TALKS ON SYNODALITY I would like to thank Fr Timothy Radcliffe for initiating this series of Lenten Talks last Wednesday, and for the wonderful attendance of so many people from the parish and Diocese.

Second Talk on Wednesday 28th February at 7.30 p.m. with Fr Jan Nowotnic - who was also present as a voting member of the Synod. Fr Jan is a Priest of the Archdiocese of Birmingham and Director of Mission for the Bishops' Conference, and its National Ecumenical Officer. The variety of speakers who all attended the Synod in Rome last October, will help us to get a much broader picture of the who process of Synodality in the Church.

SYNODALITY - means journeying together as the People of God. It indicates a way of listening to each individual person as a member of the Church to understand how God might be speaking to all of us.

Third Talk by Mr Austin Evereigh will take place on **Wednesday 6th March** at 7.30 p.m.. Mr Evereigh is a Roman Catholic Journalist, Biographer of Pope Francis; Writer, speaker on contemporary Church affairs. He has just written a new book on Pope Francis which was published this week "First belong to God" - On Retreat with Pope Francis. The book will be available at the talk, and if you would like Mr Evereigh to sign it, he will be available at the end of the talk and questions.

Fourth Talk Will be given by Bishop Nicholas Hudson - Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster on Wednesday 13th March at 7.30 p.m. . Bishop Nicholas was the former Rector of the Venerable English College in Rome and will speak about the Synod in relation to the New Evangelisation.


