Spiritual Reflection:

Pope Francis caused quite a stir when, at the beginning of his Pontificate, with a memorable turn of phrase he encouraged the clergy to be 'shepherds living with the smell of the sheep'. Later, in Evangelii Gaudium he said the same call extends to every believer because we are all called to be missionary disciples: 'Evangelisers thus take on the "smell of the sheep" and the sheep are willing to hear their voice'. Now we all know that sheep don't smell too good - come to think of it, neither does the shepherd. Herding, feeding, and watering livestock of any kind is hard, manual, sweaty labour, out in all kinds of weather braving the elements. Shepherds must be appropriately dressed and equipped - they are roughly dressed for rough work.

So, who is the shepherd and who are the sheep? The Chief Shepherd is Jesus - he described himself as the 'Good Shepherd' - and we are the sheep. To be likened to sheep isn't a very flattering comparison. In Animal Farm by George Orwell the sheep are easily led, in contrast to the pigs (very intelligent animals by all accounts) who are leaders. Sheep aren't known for being especially intelligent - they wander, they stray, they graze all day oh and they smell - but they are endearing, especially the baby lambs, and they provide us with wool.

Nevertheless, we are like sheep because we all go astray. We all wander from the path of righteousness, we all follow the herd, and we all need the guidance of the Good Shepherd. We are all lost sheep and can only be found by the Shepherd. We have the smell of the sheep about us.

The Good Shepherd leads us out of our cold indifference into the warmth of God's merciful and compassionate love for everyone, but especially the little ones: the poor, the vulnerable, those who grieve and those facing difficult challenges. The Good Shepherd guides us to live, not according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit and to produce the good fruit of the Spirit: 'love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness,


goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law'.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. Here in the Diocese of Brentwood we have a Deacon Frank Westcott from St Edmund's Parish in Loughton who will be Ordained to the Sacred Priesthood on Saturday 22nd



June, the Feast of SS John Fisher & Thomas More. And we only have two other students for the priesthood. We really need to pray earnestly for more vocations to the priesthood here in our own Diocese. This must be a priority for the future of the Church. As you're probably aware, the formation for Priests is several years, so we will have some very lean years ahead of us. The age of the clergy is now very top heavy, which is profoundly going to affect all our parishes in the future. Bishop Alan's Vision Document is addressing all these issues, especially with regard to Partnerships. The emphasis will be on much more co-operation between parishes. This was also reflected in the Synod on Synodality last October, and which will continue in the Second session this October. The Lord Jesus said, "that the harvest is rich, but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest." I have always believed that the harvest is rich, men and women need more encouragement and courage to pursue Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. The world has changed dramatically

in the past 50 years, gone are the days where young men were encouraged to pursue a vocation, hence the diminishing numbers presenting themselves. With constant prayer and asking the 'Lord of the Harvest', I'm positive our prayers will be heard. Sometimes, it even means taking a leap of faith. If God wants you, he will certainly make it known to you!

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES: What is an irregular marriage? Every Roman Catholic is bound by Church Law by virtue of their Catholic baptism to celebrate all the Sacraments within the context of the Roman Catholic Faith. If a marriage contracted by a Roman Catholic outside of this context, e.g. in a Non-Catholic Church without dispensation from the Bishop, in any secular venue, in Las Vegas, on a beach, or a hotel. These marriages, though Civil, are not recognised the Church. If a person wishes

to rectify this situation with the Church and their faith, we have a process called Convalidation. If there are no preventative measures for Convalidation, e.g. a previous marriage that needs annulment; we can offer couples this very private and confidential service. Both Fr John & Fr Gary are Canon Lawyers and will be able to explain the whole process to you if you want to know more.
