

# SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (B) Sunday 12th May 2024

## Spiritual Reflection:



This Sunday we have listened to the beautiful 'Priestly Prayer of Christ' from St. John's Gospel. Jesus, recognising his own fate and his eventual death, prays earnestly for the Apostles. Those men whom he called and prepared for the future work of the Church, he now entrusts to the Father, that he will look after each one of them. Jesus knows that they will be challenged because of him, but he also knows that they will have the strength and courage to continue with the work of

Evangelisation. They will eventually take the Gospel message to all known quarters of the world.

As we have just celebrated the Ascension of the Lord, now the work of the apostles must begin. In the Acts of the Apostles, we have been listening to all the events of the early church; the teething problems that the apostles faced, and the various trials they had to encounter in sharing the Good News. But Jesus promised to be with them until the end of the age. And through the gift of the Holy Spirit, they had great courage and strength to continue this work that the Lord had begun. So, the ongoing story of Jesus Christ continues today through you and me!

We look forward to the outpouring of the gift of the Holy Spirit promised by the Lord to the Apostles. The Spirit who is that guiding force of love within the life faith and the Church, who is forever present to each one of us.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

As Roman Catholics, the most important thing we do is to celebrate the Eucharist on a weekly basis; it is where we gather to express our gratitude to Almighty God for the gift of his Son Jesus Christ, who comes to us through the 'Miracle of the Mass'. As our children learn to understand and love the Holy Eucharist, they begin to grow in their faith. Let us pray today that these children will always love and respect this precious gift that if offered to them by Jesus Christ. The next First Holy Communion celebration will

take place on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June at 11.00am & 2.00pm. Please pray also for these children.

CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION Next Sunday 19th May, we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost, which marks the birthday of the Church. In all the Parishes throughout our Diocese the



Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated. Here at the Cathedral Parish Bishop Alan will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on twenty-two of our young adults at the 11.30 a.m. Mass. This is a truly momentous time in their journey of faith; and as young adults they are making a commitment to Almighty God to continue to follow his Son Jesus Christ through the practice and living out of their Catholic Faith. I would encourage all these young people to seriously think of different ways that they can get involved in the life of the Church; through becoming a Reader at Holy Mass, by helping with our Sunday Morning Coffee Rotas, by becoming a Catechist, helping with the Children's Sunday Liturgy. The Sacrament of Confirmation is the 'Sacrament of Mission', which means becoming an active member of the Church. I would personally like to thank Fr Gary for putting the whole Confirmation Programme together and all the Catechists who helped him over the past nine months. Our young people really did get a good Catechesis in preparation for the reception of the Sacrament.

DECORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL As you will see when you attend the Cathedral, our Blessed Sacrament Chapel is being decorated at present. There is scaffolding behind the barrier. I would ask all our parishioners to be extremely careful when moving around the Cathedral. Hopefully the work in the Chapel should take approximately two weeks. Unfortunately, the walls of the Chapel have become extremely dirty, mainly due to the use of candles. Hopefully painting the Chapel will certainly brighten it up.

YOUR WEEKLY OFFERTORY Just a brief note to say thank you to the whole parish community for your ongoing support through your Weekly Offertory. As you can appreciate, the Cathedral is one of the largest parishes in the Diocese, we have several buildings that



we must heat and light, and the upkeep is extremely high. Your offertory offsets the weekly costs. I am sure every household knows the running costs of your homes and how expensive everything is, especially utilities, water, maintenance, and repairs of the property. We also pay the diocese £4716.31 every month as our Diocesan Quota (the highest in the diocese). This

assists in helping run the administration costs in the diocese at Cathedral House, the Bishop's Office, and all the various offices & departments that help all the parishes in the Diocese. I believe many of you belong to the Parish Gift Aid Scheme, which is wonderful; and for every pound you donate we can claim back 25 pence in the pound from the Inland Revenue at the end of the tax year. If you haven't increased your weekly offertory in a long time, could I ask you to seriously consider this, and if you're able to make an increase, as we have just begun the new tax year, this may be a good opportunity to review your offertory. Your weekly offering will certainly assist in the administration and running costs of the Cathedral Parish. With grateful thanks to you all.
