Spiritual Reflection:


In his teaching Jesus highlights a problem, if you like, with practice the of faith. Those who are diligent, externally faithful, dutiful and adhere to the rules can appear as holy and righteous. In truth, many are, because how else do we witness to faith than by practicing it? But what if this practice of faith - these acts of piety, intend to express both our love of God and our neighbour - masks the true condition of our hearts, as we know was the case with many of the Pharisees in Jesus' day?

The Pharisees had strict rules on ritual cleanliness, which they adhered to scrupulously. Jesus' disciples, it appears, were more laid back in this department, earning them the rebuke of the Pharisees. Jesus, however, as he so often does, strikes at the heart of the matter. We are not made clean or righteous or acceptable to God



by some kind of external cleansing process because such things do not change our hearts.

Let us look into our own hearts. Do we recognise any of the following in our own heart: evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance, and folly? If the answer is yes, what then do we conclude? That we are righteous? No, of course not. We recognise that we are sinners in need of salvation, and we cry out, as Paul cried out, 'Who will deliver me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord.'



We need to resist the spirit of the Pharisee, which lurks in us all. The spirit of the Pharisee is alive and kicking when we think things such as: don't say anything that could offend anyone; focus on what is right with the 'church' and its leadership; don't be critical; promote the status quo; don't make 'waves'; don't call

anyone 'out'; respect 'authority'; don't expose 'wrong doing'; cover up those who 'spiritually abuse others - keep it 'secret' within the family; don't ask any hard questions. The refuge of the Pharisee in us is hypocrisy - in the name of Jesus, resist it, cast it out and strive to live truthful, honest, and authentic Christian lives.

INTRODUCTION TO FR MATÚŜ MELEG I recently met with Fr Matúŝ (pronounced Matoosh) and talked to him about life here at the Cathedral Parish. At present, he is on holiday at home in Slovakia with his family before he takes up his assignment on Friday 6th September. Please extend him a very warm welcome next weekend.

FR MATÚŜ WRITES "My name is Matúŝ Meleg. I was born in Slovakia to a Catholic family soon after the end of communism. When I was 16, I received a scholarship to study A-levels in the UK. I studied at Culford School near Bury St Edmunds for a year. After I had finished my lower sixth form I decided to continue my studies back in Slovakia. In 2010 I started my university studies in Maths during which I realised I could no longer delay my response to my vocation. In 2014 I moved back to the UK and started my degree in Theology at King's College, London. At that time, I stayed with a Polish priest in South Woodford. As I finished my degree, I realised that Brentwood diocese was my new home, and it was precisely this diocese God wanted me to serve. Therefore, in 2018 I became a seminarian. After spending couple years in Allen Hall and then in Grays parish, I got ordained first deacon in 2023 and then last March, I got ordained priest. For my first placement, the Bishop decided that I should remain in Grays and now, I am looking forward to serving the parish in my new placement, here in Brentwood Cathedral. - c) If you plan to send your daughter or son to the Ursuline School, you do not require a Certificate of Catholic Practice.
- d) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practising your faith, please see Fr John
- e) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have *not* been practising your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic school of your choice.
- f) Please note that Fr John will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

Fr John will be available only at the following times in the Cathedral to see parents who are *registered as parishioners*

and who are practicing their faith by attending Sunday Mass. There is no need to make an appointment.


