

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (C) Sunday 22nd December 2024

Spiritual Reflection:

'O Rising Sun, you are the splendour of eternal light and the sun of justice. O come and enlighten those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.' St Ignatius of Antioch wrote, Mary's virginity and giving birth, and even the Lord's death escaped the notice of the prince of this world; these three mysteries worthy of proclamation were accomplished in God's silence. 'Today, with the great feast of Christmas Day just around the corner, we urge you to find some peace and quiet to reflect in prayer



and silence on one of these mysteries, the mystery of Jesus' birth.



The Virgin Birth is beyond human understanding. That a human being could be conceived without human seed and by the Holy Spirit defies nature and stands before us as one of the most amazing and incredible miraculous interventions of God in human affairs. Faith in the virginal conception of Jesus has always been met with opposition, mockery, and incomprehension from many

quarters. The Church has from the beginning confessed and proclaimed that Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary.

When he came to earth, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity became a human being just like us. Turning once again to St. Ignatius of Antioch, we affirm with a hearty Amen that we too 'are firmly convinced about the Lord, who is truly of the race of David, according to the will and power of God, truly born of a virgin...he was truly nailed to a tree for us in his flesh under Pontius Pilate...he truly suffered, as he is also truly risen.'

As we ground ourselves in our faith, we will become increasingly more certain of the truth that Jesus was born of the Virgin. We will also grow in our understanding that while Jesus is Mary's only son, her spiritual motherhood extends to all humankind. God is our Father. Mary is the spiritual mother of all believers, and we strive with all our heart, soul and strength during Advent & Christmas tide to imitate her.

We have finally reached the birthday of Our Lord once again into our lives this Christmas. The Nativity of Our Lord has been the focus of millions of people over the past two millennia. The fact that Almighty God deigned to send his only Son into our world in

the innocence of the Christ-child, and how this event went almost unnoticed, gives us an insight into God's greatest plan of all - that a Saviour was born for us! The Messiah enters the world and only a few shepherds and the Magi know of this birth. But his day will come, when as a man he will bring the Good News to the Poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and set the downtrodden free. Jesus Christ is born for each one of us this Christmas, like the shepherds and Magi let us fall on our knees and worship Him.

HOLY YEAR 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE On Christmas Eve our Holy Father, Pope Francis, will open the Holy Year Door in St Peter's Basilica, marking the beginning of the Holy Year 2025. The concept of a Holy Year has deep roots in the history of the Catholic Church, and is centred around pilgrimage to Rome, spiritual renewal and the forgiveness



of sins. This tradition originated in ancient Jewish custom and was revived for Christian communities in the Middle Ages by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. The theme will be Pilgrims of Hope, and as a parish, we are going to focus on the Holy Eucharist, giving everyone the opportunity to deepen their love of Jesus Christ thought the Holy Eucharist. There will be Lenten Talks on the Eucharist, Forty Hours of Eucharistic Prayer, and various other events. Bishop Alan will preside at the 11.30 a.m. Mass on Sunday 29th December, the Feast of the Holy Family, to inaugurate the Holy Year in our Diocese.
