THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD
Sunday 12th January 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

Today the season of Christmastide draws to a close. It reaches a wonderful climax in a definitive event in the Lord's life: his baptism in the Jordan. Jesus' baptism was a remarkable event because the baptism offered by John the Baptist was for repentance. The immersion in the waters of the Jordan was a sign of conversion, or a person changing direction in life. John's message was addressed to tax collectors, soldiers and ordinary men and women. It was a message of moral reform, of preparing for the coming of the Messiah. Jesus' baptism is a baptism of solidarity with sinners and began his public life and in this moment, God is revealed as Blessed Trinity.



The Trinity is unique to Christian faith. We are united to Muslims and Jews because we share a common belief in One God, but at this point our faith departs sharply from these two other faiths because we believe that God is three Persons in One God - The Holy Blessed Trinity. God is Father, God is Son and God is Holy Spirit. Jesus' baptism was the manifestation, of Jesus as

Messiah of Israel and the Son of God. The unveiling of Jesus' nature and mission brought forth from the Father a tender and heart-warming affirmation: You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'

Jesus' baptism was the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's Suffering Servant. He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners - he is truly 'the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!' In today's Gospel we are seeing unfolding before our very eyes the 'fulfilling of all righteousness.' We are witnesses of Jesus consenting to submit himself entirely to his Father's will, which was his death on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins.

The coming down of the Spirit of Jesus' baptism looked forward to the coming down of the Holy Spirit on us - a prelude, if you like, to the new creation. We commit ourselves to entering more deeply into the mystery of our baptism, praying about it, seeking to understand it and growing in our appreciation of this wonderful grace.

Dear Friends in Christ

Do you know that date you were baptised? Pope St John Paul II, believed the day of his baptism was the greatest day of his life. Our initiation into the Christian life commences on the day of our Baptism. In the Gospel today we see Jesus' baptism. It



actually wasn't necessary for him to be baptised as he was free from sin; but he uses it as a witness to those around, how he wishes to be associated with with sinful humanity, as Saviour. The sacred promises made by our loving parents on the day of a child's baptism are an eternal legacy to the child, that they will do everything in their power to keep that child on the path of Jesus Christ, and ultimately, leading to God. Baptism, is the gateway to the Sacramental Life; we begin that great journey

of discovery, and live out daily those promises so solemnly made on our behalf. Perhaps, you can look at your Baptismal Certificate today and memorise the date of your Baptism.

HOLY YEAR - PARISH OUTREACH As part of our Holy Year celebrations, as a Parish I would like to launch a Parish Outreach initiative. Judging by the incredible numbers we had here for our Christmas Masses, there are obviously a lot of parishioners who do not attend Sunday Mass regularly. Especially today, which is the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, the sacred promises made to Almighty God on the day of a child's Baptism are certainly binding. I truly believe it is about our personal integrity before God, and importantly and especially for parents. When you make certain promises on behalf of the most precious person in your life, namely your child, it would be disastrous to think that that sacred promise was broken or even abandoned.



The consolation is, that God never gives up on any of us, and like the lost sheep, is always searching out and desiring us to return home to the fold. If you know of anyone who has seriously lapsed from the faith, and many did after Covid, please gently and encouragingly

extend an invitation to return to the regular weekly practice. There are plenty of newsletters printed weekly, even if you pushed one through a neighbour's door or give one to someone you know who may not be attending anymore, at least it is an opportunity for them to keep in touch. Or if it is a family member, please encourage them to return. For less than an hour a week, we can give praise to God in thanksgiving for the many graces and blessing which he bestows on our lives, and those blessings are many and varied.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025 Next Saturday 18th January our First Holy Communion Programme commences with as special Mass of Welcome and Introduction

to the programme at 9.15 a.m. The Mass is for the parents and children who will be preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist. By now, you will have received information with regard the programme and the various sessions for the children. It is



imperative that the children attend every session of the programme; if a child has to miss a session, for whatever reason, you must speak to Fr John about this in person. This is one of the most important times in your child's life, and your support and encouragement is essential. The last time I spoke to parents, I asked you to speak to your child about their Baptism, to show them photos of the baptism, their shawl, their baptismal candle; tell them who was present on that special day and tell them what it meant for you as their parents. The most important part of this programme is your weekly attendance at Holy Mass; none of this makes any sense whatsoever, without your presence at Mass. You are teaching your child about the importance of the most Sacred part of our Faith through the Holy Eucharist.

IRREGULAR MARRIAGES What is an irregular marriage? One that has taken place outside of the Roman Catholic Faith, i.e. In a register office; on a beach, or at a secular venue; in another Christian Church without dispensation. These marriages are only recognised by the law of the land, and not by the Catholic Church. Once a person is baptised, you are bound by your Roman Catholic faith forever. If there is no reason why a person cannot be married in the Catholic Faith, we can provide the means to rectify this irregular situation through what is called Convalidation. This is very private service offered by the Church. If you want further information, please contact Fr John on 01277 265235.
