Spiritual Reflection:



We crossed into a new millennium over twenty years ago and a new stage of the Church's journey began. At the heart of this new adventure was the new evangelisation; a fresh, new and dynamic momentum to 'put out into the deep', or 'Duc in Altum'.

Peter and his fellow disciples trusted Jesus' words and cast their nets, and 'When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.'

These words, 'put out into the deep', still ring out today, inviting us to remember the past with gratitude, live the present with enthusiasm, and look forward to the future with confidence, because 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever.'

To 'put out into the deep is related primarily to evangelisation, of winning souls for Christ. Jesus is the goal of

history and the One Saviour of the world. The Church and the Spirit cry out in unity, 'Marantha' or, 'Come, Lord Jesus'. He is also the goal and purpose of our lives, and the limits test of faith is always: do you know Jesus Christ our Lord? For in knowing and loving him we can become strengthened in grace and desire to share this blessing with others.

We are called not to be afraid but to be fishers of men and women. We are called to understand the deep desires and longings of every human heart, but to do this we must first understand our own. We thirst to know the Living God. We cry out to show his



mercy and forgiveness in such a way that the deep joy and happiness well up within.

The Spirit is the One who quenches thirst and brings new life. This is God's merciful love which was made known in Christ. When we come to touch his goodness, kindness and compassion our hearts sing out: 'O give thanks to the Lord for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever.' We are ambassadors of God's mercy, channels of his love, and witnesses of his goodness and kindness.
