THIRD and FOURTH SUNDAYS OF LENT (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sundays 23rd & 30th March 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

There is no fun in fundamentalism. This darkened and destructive way of thinking was alive in Jesus' day as it is in our own. Fundamentalism sees no shadows of grey but thinks only in black and white. Its orthodoxy is a weapon with which it beats others, should they not fall in line with its world view.

In the classic strain of fundamentalism we encounter in today's reading a disaster is associated with punishment for sin. This is an ancient and modern disease and is even found in the book of Job, 'Consider now: Who being innocent, has ever perished? Where were the upright ever destroyed? As I have observed, those who plough evil...reap it. At the breath of God, they perish...'

In today's Gospel the construction accident at Siloam reservoir at Jerusalem in which eighteen people died was attributed to their sin. This erroneous and misleading view still prevails today. For example, when the AIDS crisis broke out in the early 1980's people regarded it as the judgment of God. And in the aftermath of 9/11, it was suggested that this terrorist attack reflected in some way God's righteous judgment.

Jesus was adamant that this way of thinking was simply wrong: 'do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? I tell you no!' When people die in tragic and awful ways it doesn't reflect God's judgement. These events do, however, remind us of two sober truths: first, that we all must die and, second, that



now is the right time to change our lives, because after death we cannot repent and change - it is too late. Today is always the day for conversion and repentance.

Lent is the season of change, repentance and conversion, and a wonderful time to seek out God's healing and mercy in the sacrament of mercy, the sacrament of reconciliation. If you have not been for a while, take heart; God's mercy and forgiveness awaits you. If you receive the sacrament frequently, you are blessed because through it, with it and in it we touch the very mercy of God, who always leads us on the holy road of interior repentance and conversion.

As the Third Week of Lent begins, I would like to remind you that our Lenten Talks each focus on some aspect of the Holy Eucharist. As the Eucharist is 'the source & summit' of the Christian Life, it's imperative that that every Catholic Christian understands the Eucharist. The miracle of the Mass celebrated every time



we gather, makes truly present the Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of Jesus Christ. Not a sign or a symbol, but the 'Real Presence' of Jesus. Tragically, there are some Catholics who do not believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist.

When Christ triumphed over sin and death on the Cross of Calvary, through the power of Resurrection, the world changed forever. The Apostolic Mission began. Jesus had prepared the Apostles in those few short years, to continue that which he had started; and even though the early Christians were hounded and persecuted, they continued to grow in number. There are over 1 billion 400 million Catholics throughout the world, but sadly the only Continent where Catholicism has diminished is Europe. There are 6.2 million Catholics in England & Wales, and less than 18% practice their faith. According to the latest statistics from the Bishops' Conference, 554,000 Roman Catholics attended Mass in 2023. Covid, has had a devastating effect on the Church worldwide. As you may be aware approximately 4% of the Catholic population did not return to the practice of their faith after Covid.



The most wonderful thing about the life of faith, is that it is never too late to return to the practice of the faith. And practice means being present weekly and participating in the Eucharistic

Celebration. As the great Catholic author Matthew Kelly said in his recent book 'Thirty-three days to Eucharistic Glory "Those who believe, don't leave!" This Lent may be an opportunity for you to return to the practice of your faith. It is our faith that truly gives meaning to the whole journey of life itself.


