# SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope'

## Sunday 16th March 2025

#### Spiritual Reflection:

On Mount Tabor Ss. Peter, James & John witnessed the transfigured Lord with their own eyes. For a moment, they touched the beauty and light of heaven and knew something of the joy of paradise. We too can have a similar life-changing experience of God. But no one lives 'on Tabor' for long.

Human existence is a journey of faith and is lived more in darkness than in the fullness of light. Some experience moments of obscurity, whereas others experience profound darkness, such as Mother Teresa. While we're on earth our



relationship with God develops more with listening than with seeing, and contemplation even takes place, thanks to the interior inner light within God's Word illuminates.

Although she was the human creature closest to God, the Virgin Mary herself walked day after day as though she was on a pilgrimage of faith (Lumen gentium 58), keeping God's Word in her heart, whether through Scripture or through the events of Jesus' life, in which she recognised and accepted God's mysterious voice.



On this topic, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI declared, 'To listen to him in the word, preserved in the Sacred Scripture. To listen to him in the very events of our lives; trying to read in them the message of providence. To listen to him... in our brothers, especially in the little ones and the poor, for whom Jesus himself asked for our concrete love. To listen

to Christ and to obey his voice. This is the only way that leads to joy and love.

To be a disciple is to be transformed, transfigured even, by the light of God's wisdom which we touch when we pray, read sacred Scriptures, receive the gift of the Eucharist and serve our neighbour, especially the poor and marginalised.

#### Dear Friends in Christ

As we commence this second week of our holy Lenten Season; ask yourself, have vou remained faithful to the resolutions that you made on Ash Wednesday? It's so easy to Pray + Fast + Give fall by the wayside very guickly. But that doesn't mean that we have to give up. Lent can be a truly positive experience; a time of growth and understanding of the Lord Jesus. This Lenten journey is leading us to the moment in time when God will raise his only begotten Son out of the realms of death on Easter Day. Sin and death was conquered; and the Lord invites each one of us personally to share in that New Life, which we call our Catholic Faith. How we prepare for that is up to us. No one can do this for us. Prayer, Fasting, Works of Charity are all well and good, but if there is no real intention behind them it becomes only lipservice. Conversion-Change of Heart is what the Lord calls each one of us to.

**CAFOD LENTEN FAMILY FAST DAY**\_was last Friday. What we saved in the sacrifices and fasting on that day, will be collected in today. This is a truly tangible way of associating ourselves with the sacrifice that Jesus made for us on Calvary. Cafod work with partners across the world, wherever the need is greatest, to bring hope and compassion to poor communities, standing side by side with them

to end poverty and injustice. We work with people of all faiths and none. Please be generous in your giving. Thank you!


The talks will take place in the Cathedral and begin at 7.30pm. Please put these dates in your diaries.
