# FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 18th May 2025

#### Spiritual Reflection:

Shortly after his death Jesus gave his disciples, and us, a new commandment: 'A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another.' To be a



disciple is to be called to a life of love. And to agape love, which is rooted in self-sacrifice, in loving without thought of return, freely and unconditionally. Christian love is probably both the most important of all Christian virtues and the hardest to achieve. We may have faith, we may have hope, but don't always have love.

Here's the thing about love: we all want to be loved - more than anything else in the world, we crave love. The Greek philosopher Aristotle said: 'No one would choose a friendless existence on condition of having all the other things in the world.' In other words, we were created to receive love and to give love.

None of us is an island; none of us is without the capacity to love and be loved. Love, however, is like mercy: to show mercy we must first receive mercy; to love, we must first know we are loved.



So, we see that to be a Christian is to be called to a life of love. But how far short we fall! None of us loves as we should love. Our hearts incline so easily to malice, envy, jealousy, and rage. How can this be when we are called to love? We cannot love with our old hearts - they are callous and


hard. No, a new commandment requires a new heart: the heart of the new creation, the heart of Christ.

This new heart of love is a blessing of the Spirit which we receive when we call upon God's help, grace and strength to love in those situations where we find it hard to love, to forgive, and to show mercy where we, left to our own devices, are devoid of mercy. This kind of love, agape love, is the blessing and fruit of the Spirit and to this we are called and for this we receive every spiritual blessing and grace.

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Thursday 8th May 2025, the Conclave of 133 Cardinals through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit chose Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost to be the next Pope. He has taken the name His Holiness Pope Leo XIV. The election took place very quickly on the fourth ballot, and Pope Leo would have received a two thirds majority of the votes.

God is certainly a God of surprises; no one ever believed that an American would be chosen as Pope, but the Holy Spirit made his choice and now Pope Leo XIV

becomes the 267th Pope as successor of St Peter. His opening words to the world were 'Peace be with you,' taking the Lord's words to the Apostles at the first encounter in the upper room after the Resurrection. In fact, he mentioned the word peace nine times in his brief address, indicating that in this troubled world, of wars and conflict, that peace is desperately needed, and it is only Jesus Christ who can bring true peace into our world.

The official inaugural Mass for Pope Leo XIV will take place on **Sunday 18th May** at 10.00 a.m. in St Peter's Square. It will be televised; SKY has excellent coverage and also EWTN. It will also be televised by FOX News which can be obtained through social media. Buckingham Palace has said that the Duke of Edinburgh will represent the King at the inauguration of the new Pope this weekend.

Let us pray for our New Pope Leo XIV that he will be guided by the Holy Spirit as he becomes the Chief Shepherd of our Roman Catholic Faith following in the footsteps of St Peter; that his missionary and pastoral heart will inspire all Christians throughout the world. Already he has made it known that he wants people to be totally committed to the practice of their faith. He desires renewal and revival of the Catholic Faith, and of course this always begins with ourselves.
