SS PETER & PAUL JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 29th June 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

The most important question in the Bible is: 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' A grace of revelation is needed if we are to confess that Jesus is God, flesh and blood cannot reveal this. The human mind and of itself is not equipped to proclaim that Jesus of Nazareth is God incarnate - true God, true man. God made man. Of course, many have recognised that Jesus is a great moral teacher and one of the most impressive and significant people in human history.

Atheists, men, and women of good will and believers of other faiths recognise Jesus' greatness. But that is not the same as worshipping him as God from God, light from light, of one being with the Father. This grace, which even we may take for granted, is a special gift for the Father. There is a way in which we need to ask ourselves this question every day. Who do you say Jesus of



Nazareth is? Our prayer and reading of Scriptures are rooted in

the quest to answer this question, asking the Holy Spirit to grant us the secrets of revelation, 'the secret thing (belonging) unto the Lord', which we will spend the rest of our lives plumbing and quarrying. As we bow before this mystery, we will hear God say to us: 'I am God, and there is no other. I make known the end from the beginning, for ancient times, which is still to come.'

Despite Peter's confession it is sobering that the rock upon which the Church was built was the same man whom Jesus identified as being, unwittingly for sure, a vehicle for Satan: 'Get behind me Satan!' We all stumble, fall, get confused and are led astray. This is why this grace of revelation needs to be cultivated and protected. The devil is like a roaring lion looking to devour our faith; erode it, diminish it, and undermine it. Stand firm; resist the evil one and he will flee. Jesus is God made man; he became man that we might become divine and share in the life of the Blessed Trinity.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Since the election of Pope Leo XIV, there has been a great deal of interest expressed and shown in the Roman Catholic Faith. Obviously, with the recent death of Pope Francis, and the election of Pope Leo, high profile has been given to the Church by the media. Already we are beginning to see the fruits of Pope Leo's pontificate. And of course, no one could deny the power and working of the Holy Spirit in this election. I personally have never been more convinced that the Lord provides us always with what we need in the Church, and when we need it. Pope Leo is most definitely God's choice as our Supreme Shepherd, our Pontifex Maximus - (Greatest Pontiff).

It has also been pointed out in many recent Catholic articles that interest in Catholicism over the past year or so is leading many young people, not only to return to the practice of their faith, but also for many to seek



entry into the Catholic Faith through the RCIA (Journey of Faith) programme. This year we received eight new members into the

Church. In one article I read, it stated that so many people are fed up with secularism and materialism and have come to realise that there is far more to the meaning of life than satisfying our own needs and wants. These are interesting views. If there are any of our regular parishioners (perhaps spouse of a Catholic husband or wife), who, as yet, have not sought entry into the Catholic faith, and would like to more about Catholicism, every September we begin a new RCIA - Journey of Faith Program. Please speak to Fr John, I will be extremely willing to explain the whole programme to you. This Year, God may be calling you to follow him into the Catholic Faith, will you answer that call? 'Come and See!'



BRENTWOOD DIOCESAN YOUTH SERVICE BCYS has served our Diocese for nearly fifty years. On the first Thursday of the Month there is a gathering of young people from all over the diocese, mostly fifteen years old upwards. RETURNING TO THE PRACTICE OF THE CATHOLIC FAITH Covid had a devastating effect on the entire world, but also on the Catholic Church at large. Many practicing Roman Catholics prior to the pandemic were regular Church goers, but when the churches reopened once again, many people did not return to the weekly practice of faith. The tragedy is that many of our



young people have now been deprived of regular church attendance and have most certainly got out of the weekly habit. The Church has always taught that 'We keep holy the Sabbath

Day;' and for Catholics our Sabbath Day is the Sunday Celebration of Holy Mass. I make this impassioned appeal to the whole parish community to return to the regular practice of faith. Our one obligation as Roman Catholics is to participate and share in the Holy Mass once a week on Saturday evening or Sunday. The Mass is the Sacrament of Unity, bringing us together weekly to give thanks and gratitude to God for so much that he gives to us. THIS WEEKEND WE WELCOME DEACON ANDREI ILIES, who will be on pastoral placement for a about a month here in the Parish. Please help to make him feel welcome. Fr John

I was born in Buzau, a town in the south-east of Romania, in a family with a strong Roman Catholic tradition, being the second of three children. Together with my family I regularly attended Mass in the local parish, and this helped me to get to know the life of the parish as well as to develop beautiful friendships with other children my age. Our parents taught us the importance of personal prayer as well as family prayer which we practiced often.

At the age of fifteen I was admitted to the minor seminary, a decision that was well supported by my family and the local parish. My time at the seminary gave me the opportunity to learn more about the spiritual life, prayer as well

as to study Scripture, the Catechism of the Catholic Church along with the subjects taught in other schools.

During this period, I became interested in Ignatian spirituality and got in touch with the Jesuit priests who had resumed their activity in Romania after the fall of the communist regime. At the end of the four years of seminary I was admitted to the Society of Jesus where I had the opportunity to continue my formation for the next five years, the first two years in the novitiate followed by a period of involvement in various Jesuit projects in Romania.

The sudden death of my father in 2001 brought important changes in our family. After leaving the Society of Jesus I started my nursing training and was happy to help my mother settle into her new home in the village where she was born.

This large new community also became my home for the next few years. While working as a nurse at the local hospital I became a member of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and became involved in several projects that the local conference ran in support of people in need.

Being interested in doing some work experience abroad, I was happy when I got a job at Colchester Hospital, UK, in a surgical ward, the same field I was working in Romania.

At the beginning of 2015 I moved to the UK and the parish of St. James the Less and St. Helen, Colchester, became my first parish in the UK, where I later had the opportunity to get involved again in the activities of St. Vincent de Paul Society. The work in the parish was complemented by participation in the Diocesan Pilgrimages to Lourdes as a member of the medical team, where I had the opportunity to collaborate with people from other parishes.

My time in Colchester was followed by a job at Springfield Hospital, in Chelmsford, which is why I moved to Basildon. It was during this time that I began vocational discernment, with the help of the spiritual director and several people from the diocese. I am grateful that Bishop Alan Williams accepted my application and gave me the opportunity to do my formation at Beda College in Rome.

After three years of formation in seminary, which included philosophical and theological studies, as well as pastoral work in the diocese during summer, I was ordained deacon in St. Paul Outside the Walls Basilica, on 18th June this year by Most Rev. Malcom McMahon, Archbishop Emeritus of Liverpool.

I entrust myself to your prayers to always seek and fulfil God's will.
