# THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 22nd June 2025

## Spiritual Reflection:

Today we celebrate the Sacrament which is the source and summit of the Christian life. This phrase 'source and summit' is a rather awesome one. It is as if in the blessed Eucharist is contained the entire spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Passover Lamb. The great St. Irenaeus put it so beautifully when he said many



centuries ago 'Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.' What does it mean to have our way of thinking attuned to the Eucharist?

Our word Eucharist has its roots in the Greek words *eucharistein* and *eulogein*, which recall the Jewish blessing - especially during a meal - of God's works of creation, redemption, and sanctification. At the very heart then, of the Eucharist, is a celebration of praise and thanksgiving at which

Christ is made real and present. This is why, on entering a church where the Eucharist is in the Tabernacle, we acknowledge the real presence of Christ Jesus in the Tabernacle and genuflect in adoration. We must continue to cultivate a genuine sense of Eucharistic wonder and awe. As we allow the Holy Spirit to work within us, he helps us grow in awareness of the fact that it is truly Christ himself whom we are receiving.

This understanding that Christ is real and present in the Eucharist cannot be apprehended by the senses but only by faith, and our faith relies on God's authority, for it was Jesus himself who said: 'This is my body, which is given for you.' The eminent Church father St. Cyril said, 'Do not doubt whether this is true but rather receive the words of the Saviour in faith, for since he is the truth, he cannot lie.' The Eucharist is our greatest gift; it is our richest blessing and most cherished treasure. Nothing in the Christian life compares to it for in the Eucharist is Christ himself, the 'Godhead here in hiding'.

SICK AND RETIRED CLERGY FUND This weekend we have the annual retiring collection for the Sick and Retired Clergy of the Diocese of Brentwood. We have over twenty retired priests in the diocese; some of them are infirmed and must be cared for in Care Homes. Others are in their 70's, 80's & 90's. All

the retired priests will be on a state pension, but the Diocese doesn't provide a private pension scheme for the clergy. This is why this annual retiring collection is important; it not only gives the clergy a little extra other than their pensions, but helps them pay their respective bills in their places of residence. Most of the Priests who are retired have given fifty years of their lives in the service of the Diocese as Parish Priests to various communities. I have a personal responsibility for our Sick & Retired Clergy, ensuring they are provided for and cared for in the best way possible. If you can help in anyway whatsoever, please contribute generously to this retiring collection this weekend.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - GOING FORTH MASS: Next Sunday 22nd June at the 9.30 a.m. Mass. Fifty-four of our parish children made their First Holy Communion last month, and now they all come together to share in the great gift of the



Eucharist and receive the Lord's Blessing as they 'Go Forth' in their young lives of faith. The Catholic Faith teaches us that once we receive our First Holy Communion at the age of reason, we have an obligation to participate in the weekly celebration of Holv Mass. I would commend this teaching to all our parents. Sadly, since Covid, many families have fallen by the wayside in the practice of their faith, often only making an appearance it's time for sacramental preparation when and then disappearing again after the celebration. This is not only an insult to Almighty God, but also an insult to these young children, whose example from parents is their model of life. Can I make an impassioned plea to all parents to continue to bring your children to Holy Mass each week and help them deepen their understanding and commitment in the life of faith.

My sincere and grateful thanks to our Team of Catechists who have worked so hard with the children over the past several months. The catechists give of their time freely, and it's a real commitment in faith. FORTY HOURS OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION -QUARANT ORE In this Holy Year - as Pilgrims of Hope, our parish will be celebrating the 'Quarant ore' - the 'Forty Hours' of Eucharistic Adoration. There will be a special Mass on

Thursday 26th June at 7.30 p.m. followed by Exposition of the

Blessed Sacrament until Midnight and then resuming Exposition again from Friday 27th June at 6.00 a.m. and concluding with Solemn Benediction at 5.45 p.m. on Saturday 28th June. Our guest preacher will be Monsignor Kevin Hale, Parish Priest of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Leigh-on-Sea. For over 35 years I have always tried to offer the opportunity for the parishes where I have served to celebrate the 'Quarant Ore.' This is a real moment of grace for any parish, and especially being the Mother Church of the Diocese, we open our doors to all the Diocesan Parishes. Where parishes are thriving throughout the world, Prayer and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament are regular features of these parishes. When Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples, his question to them was "Can you not watch with me for one hour?"

During this 'Quarant Ore' I am asking every member of our Cathedral Parish to give one hour, or more, to the Lord. To help with prayer, choose a special intention that you wish to pray for. You can pray the Rosary with this intention in mind or, bring your bible and read or just sit and meditate before the Blessed Sacrament. There are lists in the Narthex to sign up for an hour. May I ask the men of the parish to cover the nightshift (Friday night through Saturday morning).

If you're on your way to work and have done an hour of prayer, there will be a light breakfast available of teas/coffees/cereals/toast and butties in the Parish Hall Friday & Saturday mornings from 6.45 a.m. - 8.15 a.m.

There are lists in the Narthex to sign up for Eucharistic Adoration. If you can give more than one hour, please put your name on the lists. Let these Forty Hours truly be a very special time for our parish. The power of prayer, as Jesus said, can move mountains. Perhaps one of the special intentions can be to encourage our lapsed Catholics to return to the practice of the faith. The Lord always hears our prayers!

A nice way to be involved in the Forty Hours would be to purchase a long burning candle in remembrance of deceased loved ones. These candles will be lit throughout the whole of


