TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 17 August 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

It is an amazing reality of the Christian faith that Jesus of Nazareth whom we worship and adore as God made man, lived, breathed, and moved in an age without television, radio, the Internet or even the motor car. He was born into an ancient world without the printing press or means of communication which can reach, in an instant, millions of people. And yet, his words,



the most holy, sacred and loving ever spoken, resound through history, speaking to every person, person to person, heart to heart, one to one.

His sweet words speak of those who are blessed; they speak of kindness, mercy, turning the other cheek and forgiving from the heart. His bitter words speak of judgement, punishment, millstones, hell and division. The thing is that with Jesus, as much as one might want to pick and mix, select this teaching over that one, or prefer his sweet to his bitter words, we cannot: we have to study and pray on all of Jesus' words.

Today we encounter an especially bitter teaching. It's hard, isn't it; to think that the Prince of Peace, whose first words after he had risen were 'Peace be with you', says also 'Do you think I came to bring Peace to earth? No, I tell you, but division'. The trust in the name of Jesus divides as much as it unites. There are many in our world who despise the name of Jesus. Indeed, his name is used by many as a word of cursing. Try mentioning Jesus' name in polite company. Sometimes even in Church circles, to mention the name of Jesus creates a hostile reaction. Why is this? It is because Jesus is God. His is the name above all other names and before him all things, in heaven and on earth, will bow down. Jesus did come to bring peace on earth but this peace was secured through the bloody suffering of his cross. First came division, hatred and violence, and then came the peace that only Jesus the Prince of Peace, can pour out, the peace of Christ in our hearts.

PARISH CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: At a recent meeting of the Confirmation Catechists, we have made a unanimous decision to open the Confirmation Programme from Year 10 - to Year 13. Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation





Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Year 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation over the summer holidays. There will be an Information Evening for prospective Candidates and their parents on Thursday 26th September at 7.00pm in the Parish Hall.

CONFIRMATION CATECHISTS: As the programme will change slightly with additional Confirmations; we will need some additional help with Confirmation Catechists. If you are willing to help, please speak to Fr Matúš. If there are any RE teachers willing to help, we would be truly grateful. Thank you!

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026: Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If your child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the

Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish. Parents' Information Evening will take place on Monday 6th October at 7.30pm in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS – JOURNEY OF FAITH PROGRAMME: Will commence on Thursday, 11th September. If anyone is interested in learning more about the Roman Catholic Faith possibly with the intention of being received into full
