TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 24 August 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

The Cardinal & theologian Hans von Balthasar wrote a controversial treatise called Dare We Hope 'That All Men Be Saved'? Having explored this profound theme, he concluded that ultimately all judgment is God's and God's alone. The Catholic Church has never made any declaration about who it thinks will be finally dammed but prays that every human person will be saved.

The Scripture scholar Origen caused a stir in the early church by suggesting that so immense was Jesus' saving death on the cross that even Lucifer, Satan himself, would be redeemed. Interestingly, despite being arguably the greatest scripture scholar the Church has ever known, he was never made a saint. The late Pope Francis provoked



controversy when he suggested that atheists could be redeemed through their good works. We, for our part, look to Scripture and the wisdom and light they offer.


In his teaching Jesus made it clear that each one of us needs to make every effort to enter through the narrow door and that salvation involves having a living, vital, dynamic relationship with God. The opposite - a cold, distant, dysfunctional relationship with him - invites the rather harsh rebuke: 'I do not know where you come from.' The response to this rebuke is interesting: 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.' People rejected Jesus then and they reject him now.

Christian Salvation is not about being good moral or worthy, because we are none of these. Salvation is about believing Jesus of Nazareth is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Through having faith in him, knowing him and walking with him in this life, we inherit eternal life.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) - JOURNEY OF FAITH: Will commence on Thursday 11th September at 7.00pm in Clergy House. If anyone is interested in learning more about the Roman Catholic Faith possibly with the intention of being received into full communion with the faith at the Easter Vigil



next year 2026. Please contact Fr John (Tel No: 01277 265235), he will be only too willing to explain the whole process to you. I know there are many spouses who attend Mass on a regular basis, who may not necessarily be Roman Catholic, please consider joining our programme.

PARISH CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: At a recent meeting of the Confirmation Catechists, we have made a unanimous decision to open the Confirmation Programme from Year 10 - to Year 13.

Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation especially in this first year. Total commitment to the practice of the faith is required, meaning weekly attendance at Holy Mass. Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the



priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Year 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation over the summer holidays. There will be an Information Evening on Thursday prospective Candidates and their parents on Thursday 26th September at 7.00pm in the Parish Hall.

CONFIRMATION CATECHISTS: As the programme will change slightly with additional Confirmand; we will need some additional help with Confirmation Catechists. If you are willing to help, please speak to Fr Matúš. If there are any RE teachers willing to help, we would be truly grateful. Thank you!

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026: Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If you child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish. Parents' Information Evening will take place on Monday 6th October at 7.30pm in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.

CATHEDRAL PARISH BAZAAR: I know this is only the middle of the summer, but forward planning is extremely important. I have set a date for a Bazaar Committee Meeting for Friday 19th September 2025 at 7.30pm in the Small Hall. We had a truly wonderful and successful Bazaar last
