# TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope'

Sunday 31 August 2025

Jesus was clearly very astute: Luke records that he noticed how the guests at the banquet were keen to secure the most high-profile places; they wanted to be seen, heard and noticed! Jesus' parable is, like many of his parables, amusing - the image of a guest taking one of the prime seats only to be told to vacate it for someone more important is definitely funny! So much of Jesus' moral and ethical teaching can be summed up by the simple statement: 'For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who, humble themselves will be exalted'.

Perhaps in all the teachings of Jesus, his teaching on humility is ultimately the most difficult one. And the reason for this is because humility, the very opposite of pride, does not come remotely naturally to us. Although the stain of the form of original sin is removed in baptism, we are wounded by it throughout the course of our lives. The ancients used to say that the most important virtue to obtain was wisdom: 'Whatever you do get wisdom'.

However, from a Christian perspective, the most important virtue to get is humility: 'Whatever you do get humility.'

The problem is humility is often misunderstood. We tend to think of humility as having low self-esteem, having a negative self-image, and the wallowing in self-deprecation and self-effacement. This of course is a myth because humility simply means that we have a sense of God's greatness and our own littleness before his glory and majesty, and a real sense of our own dignity as a son or daughter of God. Humility also means that we rest secure in God's love and mercy. And don't seek the affirmation that comes from showing off about things we have achieved as these are transitory and meaningless. The Spirit teaches us to pity the proud and to have sympathy for their and our own insecurities.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) - JOURNEY OF FAITH: Programme will commence on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September at 7.00pm in Clergy House. Several people have already contacted me to enquire about the programme. The RCIA is a systematic Programme of Instruction in the Roman Catholic Faith, covering all areas of Catholicism. We meet weekly on a Thursday, and Fr John will give an



instruction on a particular topic, and the enquirers will have the opportunity to ask questions and have informal discussion. The topics studies are: Who is God? Creation; Original Sin; God's Plan of Salvation; The Promise of a Saviour: Jesus Christ truly God and truly man; The life of Jesus Christ, Passion, Death & Resurrection; The beginning of the Church; What is the Church? The Church's rules and regulations - Canon

Law; The Four Last Things (Death, Judgement, Hell & Heaven); Who is Mary & What was her role in God's Plan of Salvation? Teaching on Prayer; The Seven Sacraments; The Sacramentals; What is the Paschal Mystery? The Life of the Trinity. Preparing to be received into the Church. As you can see this is comprehensive. There is a small study book that I ask you to purchase, it's called Evangelium; it will help you with each of the topics mentioned. Also, we have a wonderful source of information that can be gleaned from the Internet if you Google a particular subject matter. #### CATHEDRAL PARISH CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME

<u>2025/26:</u> At a recent meeting of the Confirmation Catechists, we have made a unanimous decision to open the Confirmation Programme from Year 10 - to Year 13. Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation especially in this




first year. Total commitment to the practice of the faith is required, meaning weekly attendance at Holy Mass. Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the Priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Year 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation over the summer holidays. There will be an Information Evening in the Parish Hall on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> September at 7.00pm for prospective Candidates and their parents.

<u>CONFIRMATION CATECHISTS:</u> As the programme will change slightly with additional Confirmandi, we will need some additional help with Confirmation Catechists. If you are willing to help, please speak to Fr Matúš. If there are any RE teachers willing to help, we would be truly grateful. Thank you!

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026:

Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If your child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday



Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish. Parents' Information Evening will take place on *Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30pm* in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there

are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.



MASS INTENTIONS AT THE CATHEDRAL: The origin of a Mass Stipend is very ancient, from the early practice of the faithful providing bread, wine, and other necessities for the celebration of Mass and the sustenance of clergy, evolving into a monetary donation around the eighth century to support priests' livelihoods and their ministry. Today they form part of

the Priest's Annual Income, as we do not receive an official salary. Every day a Mass Intention is celebrated at Brentwood Cathedral. Parishioners book Mass intentions for various occasions, anniversaries, birthdays, deceased family members, special intentions, Golden & Silver Weddings, Get Well Intentions, and many other occasions. There are several free spaces available over the next few months, as we haven't had many Intentions of late. If you would like to Book a Mass intention, especially for anniversaries, to avoid disappointment with specific dates please book early.



ARCHSBISHOP SAINT ÓSCAR ROMERO: Archbishop John Wilson (Archbishop of Southwark), will be giving a Talk and Presentation on Saint Óscar Romero, in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30pm. Archbishop John has made a special study of St Oscar Romero, and it is a great honour and privilege to invite him to our Cathedral Parish and Diocese for this talk. BRIEF BIOGRAPHY: Saint Oscar Romero was a Salvadoran archbishop and a powerful voice for justice who was assassinated in 1980 for speaking out against human rights violations and the government's repression during El Salvador's civil war. Born in 1917,



he became a priest, bishop, and eventually Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. Though initially viewed as a conservative, the murder of his friend Father Rutilio Grande radicalized Romero, leading him to use his weekly radio sermons to denounce injustice, defend the poor, and ultimately urge the military to stop the repression, which led to his own assassination while celebrating Mass the next day.
