# EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 10 August 2025

#### Spiritual Reflection:

Astonishingly, today in the gospel Jesus compares himself to a thief who unpredictably burgles a house. In this and other ways, Jesus teaches graphically that he will return, and that his return will always be a surprise. Yet his return must not catch us unawares: 'Let your loins be girded and your lamps burning.'

Our lives of faith can become flat and lack any sense of excitement or urgency. What can inspire us? We need an element of tension to move us from apathy to zeal. God gives us the spur we need - the return of the Lord. He will come back - and when we least expect it! To create that sense of tension we must reject all unbelief that would convince us that whilst the Lord may be coming back, it will certainly not be in our lifetime. Such an assumption sets itself against Jesus' own words. It is also foolish, for his return could occur as soon as tomorrow or it may delay until sometime after our death.



People are often afraid of dealing with their fears. The Late Pope John Paul II said: 'Christians are exhorted to prepare for the Great Jubilee of the beginning of the Third Millennium by renewing their hope in the definitive coming of the Kingdom of God, preparing for it daily in their hearts, in the Christian community to which they belong, in their particular social context, and in world history itself.' The surest way to prepare our hearts for the second coming is to ask the Holy Spirit to give us a hunger, thirst and longing for it.


#### Dear Friends in Christ, SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION

On Friday 15<sup>th</sup> August we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Blessed Lady into Heaven. This is a Holy Day of Obligation and has the same status as a Sunday. There will be three Masses 9.15am, 1.10pm & 7.30pm.

This very beautiful Feast Day in honour of Our Blessed Lady, marks that moment at the end of her natural life here on earth, because she was free from the stain of the Original Sin, she was Assumed Body & Soul into Heaven. Mary's Assumption assures us that what Jesus accomplished in rising from the dead and



ascending into heaven was not limited to his own Person. Even though we are not divine, we too are meant to be in heaven with the Incarnate Son, in his home with the Father & the Spirit. Thus, the Blessed Mother's birth into heaven generates in us "an ever-new capacity to await God's future." (St John Paul II). Mary has trodden this path before us, which gives us hope and confidence for our own future journey home to God.

PARISH CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: At a recent meeting of the Confirmation Catechists, we have made a unanimous decision to open the Confirmation Programme from Year 10 - to Year 13. Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more



candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation especially in this first year. Total commitment to the practice of the faith is required, meaning weekly attendance at Holy Mass. Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Year 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation over the summer holidays. There will be an Information Evening on Thursday for prospective Candidates and their parents on Thursday 26th September at 7.00pm in the Parish Hall.

**CONFIRMATION CATECHISTS:** As the programme will change slightly with additional Confirmand; we will need some additional help with Confirmation Catechists. If you are willing to help, please speak to Fr Matúš. If there are any RE teachers willing to help, we would be truly grateful. Thank you!

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026: Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If your child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish. Parents' Information Evening will take place on Monday 6th October at 7.30pm in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.
