TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope' Sunday 7 September 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

This weekend in Rome two young men will be Canonised by Pope Leo XIV, his first Canonisations. Blessed Pier Georgio Frassati & Blessed Carlo Acutis, born approximately a hundred years apart, they have both left a very profound influence and legacy to the Roman Catholic Church, let these two young Saints continue to inspire the future generations of young people, and all of us!



Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati: (1901-1925) was a charismatic Italian Catholic layman known for his deep faith, devotion to the poor, and passion for outdoor activities like mountain climbing, often captured in his personal motto "Verso l'alto" ("To the heights"). Despite his athletic and lively personality, he dedicated his short life to social justice, serving the sick and needy, giving away his wealth, and finding spiritual depth through the Eucharist. He died at age 24 from polio, likely contracted while caring for others, and his widespread funeral attendance by

the poor revealed his hidden sanctity. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1990.



Blessed Carlo Acutis: (1991 -2006) Born in London. Grew up in Milan. He was very good with computers and used his skills to share his faith. Carlo created a website to document amazing Eucharistic miracles and approved Marian apparitions. He did this before he sadly passed away from a serious illness, leukaemia. His tomb is in Assisi. Carlo was known for being happy, his computer talents, and his deep love for the Eucharist, which is a central part of Catholic faith. This love became a very

important part of his life. <u>Pope Francis</u> declared him "Blessed" on October 10, 2020. This happened just two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. Carlo is now becoming the first saint from the <u>millennial</u> generation in the Catholic Church.

In the Catholic Church, a Chapter of Canons is a college of senior priests within a diocese, responsible for assisting the bishop in the administration and governance of the cathedral and diocese. The Chapter Meeting / and Consulters meeting immediately follows the Mass.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITITAITON OF ADULTS (RCIA) - JOURNEY OF FAITH: Programme will commence on Thursday 11th September at 7.00pm in Clergy House. Several people have already contacted me to enquire about the programme. The RCIA is a systematic Programme of Instruction in the Roman Catholic Faith, covering all areas of Catholicism. We meet weekly on a Thursday, and Fr John will give instruction on



a particular topic, and the enquirers will have the opportunity to ask questions and have informal discussion. The topics studies are: Who is God? Creation; Original Sin; God's Plan of Salvation; The Promise of a Saviour: Jesus Christ truly God and truly man; The life of Jesus Christ, Passion, Death & Resurrection; The beginning of the Church; What is the Church? The Church's rules and regulations - Canon Law; The Four Last Things (Death, Judgement, Hell & Heaven); Who is Mary & What was her role in God's Plan of Salvation? Teaching on Prayer; The Seven Sacraments; The Sacramentals; What is the Paschal Mystery? The Life of the Trinity. Preparing to be received into the Church. As you can see this is comprehensive. There is a small study book that I ask you to purchase, it's called Evangelium; it will help you with each of the topics mentioned. Also, we have a wonderful source of information that can be gleaned from the Internet if you Google a particular subject matter. If you haven't had an opportunity for a one-to-one chat with Fr John, could you call Clergy House (01277 265235) and arrange an appointment as soon as possible. CATHEDRAL PARISH CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME 2025/26: At a recent meeting of the Confirmation Catechists, we have made a unanimous decision to open the Confirmation Programme from Year 10 - to Year 13. Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation especially in this



Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the Priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Year 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation over the summer holidays. There will be an Information Evening in the Parish Hall on *Thursday 25th September at 7.00pm* for prospective Candidates and their parents. All Confirmandi are required to attend weekly Sunday Mass fulfilling their obligation. Attendance Document will be given to each candidate.

<u>CONFIRMATION CATECHISTS:</u> As the programme will change slightly with additional Confirmandi, we will need some additional help with Confirmation Catechists. 


FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026:

Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If your child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday

Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish. Parents' Information Evening will take place on *Monday 6th October at 7.30pm* in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.

ARCHSBISHOP SAINT ÓSCAR ROMERO: Archbishop John Wilson (Archbishop of Southwark), will be giving a Talk and Presentation on Saint Óscar Romero, in the Parish Hall on *Wednesday 8th October at 7.30pm*. Titled: 'Preacher of Hope, The Life and Witness of St Óscar Romero.' Archbishop John has made a special study of St Óscar Romero, and it is a great honour and privilege to invite him to our Cathedral Parish and Diocese for this talk. BRIEF BIOGRAPHY: Saint Óscar Romero was a Salvadoran archbishop and a powerful voice for justice who was assassinated in 1980 for speaking out against human rights violations and the



government's repression during El Salvador's civil war. Born in 1917, he became a priest, bishop, and eventually Archbishop of San Salvador.

Father Rutilio Grande radicalised Romero, leading him to use his weekly radio sermons to denounce injustice, defend the poor, and ultimately urge the military to stop the repression, which led to his own assassination while celebrating Mass the next day. Archbishop John has written a spiritual book on Saint Óscar entitled the 'Romero Rosary.' Copies will be available for purchase, and Archbishop John will sign them.

It always comes back to personal integrity and honesty before God. For example, if a parent states they are a weekly mass goer, and in fact, do not attend Mass, what kind of moral example is that to a child; all it shows the child is that you can lie to get what you want. Personally, I wouldn't like that to be the example that I set before my child, if I had children. As stated, honesty, truthfulness and integrity are the order of the day.
