# FEAST OF THE EXHALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS (C)

Sunday 14 September 2025

#### **Spiritual Reflection:**

The Cross was the Roman Army's preferred method of execution - the equivalent of the gallows of old or guillotine or the electric chair or lethal injection. The cross was feared, hated, despised. Doesn't that make today's feast - the Exaltation of the Holy Cross - sound like a contradiction.

The Book of numbers 21:4-9 gives us the background to John 3:14-15. God had punished the Israelites with a plague of serpents; yet, heeding their pleas for mercy, he instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and raise it up high on a pole. By gazing upon this image, victims



of snakebite were healed. God's provision in the desert of physical life for the Israelites foreshadowed God's provision at Calvary of eternal life for all peoples. As Jesus said: 'and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself.' Not only was Jesus 'lifted up' in pain and shame on the cross, but also 'lifted up' in a cloud when he ascended to glory. In the Creed we declare, 'For our sake he was crucified under

Pontius Pilate...' but we also affirm '...he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.' (Painting by Velazquez)

In ancient basilicas and Romanesque art, the cross is represented in a festive manner - often spangled with gems - and Christ is enthroned upon it in royal robes, crowned with gems instead of thorns. The focus here is not the sin that necessitated the cross or the suffering produced by the cross, but the effects of the cross - salvation, reconciliation, peace, eternal life.

Yet, while salvation is freely available, it must be appropriated by faith. Just as the Israelites gazed upon the bronze serpent we too stand at the foot of the cross and gaze upon the Crucified One now exalted as the Christ. As Paul declares: 'For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.'

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Today we celebrate National Education Sunday. This marks the beginning of the academic year. It is a day for prayer, celebration, and support for Catholic schools, universities, and everyone involved in the education sector, encouraging the community to give thanks and pray for the year ahead.



Historically the origin of Catholic Schools in this country has its roots in parish life. After Catholic Emancipation in 1829, the Catholic Church's priority was education; establishing schools and colleges, teacher's training, and with the growth of the Catholic population more schools needed to be built. The Faithful People of God, spent decades fundraising in their own localities, establishing their own parochial schools. Many of these schools were run by Religious Sisters, who truly enriched our Catholic Education system in this country. Today we stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us; all of those who sacrificed so much to give us a wonderful Catholic Education Service.

Probably for the most part, we have all benefitted from Catholic Education. But we must never take our schools for granted, and the emphasis should always be on the word 'Catholic.' When School, Parish and Home are all working together to give our children a comprehensive understanding of their Catholic Faith, then by the time they leave Junior School & Secondary School, along with the faith example from home, every child should have a rounded and deeper commitment to the practice

of faith. If any part of that threefold model, or all of it is missing, the likelihood will be lapsation in the practice of faith. Which is sad!

Year 13. Obviously, this will change the dynamic slightly, as there will probably be more candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation especially in this



Each candidate will receive their own personal attendance card to be signed each week by one of the Priests or Deacons. This is a call to all students from Years 10 -13 to seriously think about the Sacrament of Confirmation. There will be an Information Evening in the Parish Hall at **7.00pm on Thursday 25**<sup>th</sup> **September** for prospective Candidates and their parents. All Confirmandi are required to attend weekly Sunday Mass fulfilling their obligation. Attendance Document will be given to each candidate.

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2025/2026:

Once again we begin to prepare for the next First Holy Communion Programme. If your child is eligible to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist (Year 4 as of September 2025), please seriously think about this next step in their spiritual formation. The prerequisites are that you are practicing Roman Catholics attending weekly Sunday Mass, and that you live in the Cathedral Parish.

Parents' Information Evening will take place on *Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October at* 7.30pm in the Cathedral. We will need a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate. Also, if there are Parishioners who would be willing to serve as First Communion Catechists, please see Fr John or Victoria Campling.

ARCHSBISHOP SAINT ÓSCAR ROMERO: Archbishop John Wilson (Archbishop of Southwark), will be giving a Talk and Presentation on Saint Óscar Romero, in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 8th October at 7.30pm. Titled: 'Preacher of Hope, The Life and Witness of St Óscar Romero.' Archbishop John has made a special study of St Óscar Romero, and it is a great honour and privilege to invite him to our Cathedral Parish and Diocese for this talk. BRIEF BIOGRAPHY: Saint Óscar Romero was a Salvadoran archbishop and a powerful voice for justice who was assassinated in 1980 for speaking out against human rights violations and the



government's repression during El Salvador's civil war. Born in 1917, he became a priest, bishop, and eventually Archbishop of San Salvador. Father Rutilio Grande radicalised Romero, leading him to use his weekly radio sermons to denounce injustice, defend the poor, and ultimately urge the military to stop the repression, which led to his own assassination while celebrating Mass the next day.

Archbishop John has written a spiritual book on Saint Óscar entitled the 'Romero Rosary.' Copies will be available for purchase, and Archbishop John will sign them.

At this meeting the Certificate of Catholic Practice will only be signed by Fr John for those who are practicing Catholics (Weekly attendance at Holy Mass). This means your child's attendance as well. If you are not a regular practicing Catholic, please follow the instructions below. Please note:

- a) Fr John will know those families who have been practicing their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice
- b) If you have not been practicing your faith, please do not approach Fr John for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as he will not be able to provide you with this document. Instead apply directly to the Catholic School of your choice.
- c) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practicing your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic School of your choice.
- d) Please note that Fr John will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

<u>PLEAST NOTE:</u> Fr John will be available only at the following time in the Cathedral Sacristy to see parents who are <u>registered as parishioners</u> and who are practicing their faith by attending Sunday Mass. There is no need to make an appointment.
