## **THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope'**

**Sunday, 16 November 2025**

### **Spiritual Reflection**

Traditionally November is the month the Church focuses on the four last things: death, the final judgement, heaven (and hell and purgatory), and the Second Coming - sombre subjects, to be sure, but essential and foundational to our faith. Today's reading invites us to contemplate what the signs will be of the end of the world. Think of all the wars in the world and the situations of conflict that still exist.



However, the end of the world isn't necessarily a topic we give much thought to - although sometimes the challenges and difficulties we face can make it seem like the end of the world! Believers and unbelievers alike acknowledge that one day the end will come - life on earth cannot be forever. Scientists suggest that our sun will burn up the earth in about five billion years, and throughout history false prophets have proclaimed with dogmatic certainty that the 'end is nigh', only to be exposed as frauds and charlatans.

The truth is, no one knows the day or the hour of our own death or the end of life on earth. What we do know, however, is that we can rely on a number of key truths. The first is that Christ lives and he has overcome death and the powers of darkness. We can also be certain that Christ is with us. In Christ the future world has already begun. The future is not darkness, confusion or fear, but by having a sure confidence that God is with us we can face it with courage and dignity.

We believe that the Lord will return - as Judge and Saviour. Jesus is the good judge: we know his face that of the Risen Christ, of Christ crucified for us. We walk and live by faith, not by sight, and even if we might rather leave the body to live with the Lord, what definitively matters is that we live lives that are pleasing to him.

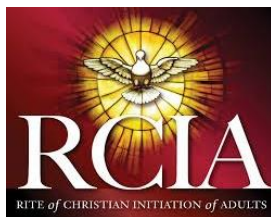

### **PRIMARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS FOR SEPTEMBER**

**2026:** If your child is eligible for Primary School Application for September 2026, you will have to make your application to the Essex County to secure this place for your child. Hand in hand with that you will need a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP) signed by your Parish Priest, stating that you are a practicing Roman Catholic who attends Church weekly with your child. A strict interpretation of this requirement is in place. If your child attends St Helen's Infant School already and you live outside of the Brentwood Cathedral Parish, you need your Parish Priest to sign the CCP form attesting to your practice: Fr John will be signing CCP Forms on ***Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> November 2025 between 4.00pm - 7.00pm.*** This will take place in the Sacristy by the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. At this meeting the Certificate of Catholic Practice will only be signed by Fr John for those who are practicing Catholics (Weekly attendance at Holy Mass). This means your child's attendance as well. If you are not a regular practicing Catholic, please follow the instructions below:

- a) Fr John will know those families who have been practicing their faith by coming to Sunday Mass. These families will receive a Certificate of Catholic Practice
- b) If you have not been practicing your faith, or have only just returned to church, please do not approach Fr John for a Certificate of Catholic Practice as he will not be able to provide you with this document, instead apply directly to the Catholic School of your choice.
- c) If you are applying for a non-Catholic school that requires evidence of religious practice and you have been practicing your faith, please simply apply directly to the non-Catholic School of your choice.
- d) Please note that Fr John will not supply additional references or documentation to parents who may go to appeal for a place at a non-Catholic school.

**PLEASE NOTE:** All applications for St Helen's Infant School should be made directly to the school; and the County Form (Essex) should be completed online by the ***15<sup>th</sup> January 2026*** to secure a place for your child for September 2026. For Infant School applications, you do not need to see Fr John.

**COFFEE AFTER 9.30 MASS** will be hosted by the SVP Group and next week will be the turn of the Scouts. Please do join us.




**MISSIO** If you have not yet returned your Missio box, could you please do so, urgently (by the end of November at the latest), either to the narthex or Clergy House. Thank you.

**CAFOD: RESPONSE IN GAZA** Your donations to Gaza since the start of the conflict have been a vital lifeline. Right now, CAFOD's partner, Caritas Jerusalem, is delivering essential medical treatment to displaced people and providing medicines to treat chronic illnesses. We have helped 1,400 households with cash to buy supplies in the last month and we are currently feeding 2,000 people with new stocks of flour and rice. Despite the restrictions on aid coming into Gaza, CAFOD's local partners are working tirelessly to help people. And with your ongoing support, they will do all in their power to keep doing so.
