FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A) JUBILEE YEAR - 'Pilgrims of Hope'

Sunday, 30 November 2025

Spiritual Reflection:

Advent is a Season of Light. It is a time in which the light of Christ shines forth into our lives and into our world, and we receive a great gift; 'to us a child is born, to us a Son is given'. In John's Gospel, Christ says of himself: 'I have come as a light into the world, that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness'.



The Advent season has its roots in the pagan festival of the winter solstice. The word 'solstice' is derived from the Latin word *sol* (sun) and *sister* (to stand still). The pagan world hungered for light and worshipped the sun god *Sol Invictus*, who was invoked each day at sunrise. As bright and as powerful as the sun is, we know it cannot cast its light on the greatest mysteries of our existence or penetrate the darkness of sin and death. The prophet Isaiah declared hundreds of years before the birth of Christ: 'The people who walked in the darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness. On them has light shined'.

Advent then is an opportunity for us to come into this light, see with the light of Christ and walk our pilgrim way such that we let our light shine.

Advent literally means 'coming' and the church has always sought to remind us during this holy season of the three comings of Christ: his first at his birth, his second at his return to earth in glory, and his third when he comes into each of our lives. The work of the Spirit in our lives is twofold: he compels us

to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of the Father, and moves us to pray with heartfelt longing, 'Come, Lord Jesus, come.'

Jesus is the meaning of Christmas. He is the meaning of human existence. The baby born in the stable, in poverty and helplessness as God made man, is our light and hope. We lift up our hearts in praise and thanksgiving for Jesus who is the Light of the World, the light which darkness could not extinguish or overcome.

DEATH OF BISHOP THOMAS McMAHON RIP: It is with great sadness that I announce the death of Bishop Thomas McMahon, Emeritus Bishop of the Diocese of Brentwood for 34 years. Bishop Thomas was a Priest of Diocese when he was called to the Episcopacy in 1980, replacing Bishop Patrick Casey who retired. He served the Diocese faithfully during those years, working ecumenically with many

Christian Churches. His Pastoral visitations were always a time of great joy in parishes, and he would spend a great deal of time with the Priests and People. He loved the Liturgy and always advocated good liturgy and music in our parishes. One of his greatest achievements was the building of the present Brentwood Cathedral, which he was very proud of. And it will be at the Cathedral that his Requiem Mass will be celebrated by His Eminence Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Bishop Alan Williams, many of the Bishops of England & Wales, Priests & People of the Diocese of Brentwood.

On **Monday, 15th December at 5.00pm** Bishop Thomas's Body will be received into the Cathedral, and Vespers will be celebrated, to which parishioners are welcome.

On **Tuesday, 16th December at 11.30am**, Requiem Mass will be celebrated followed by interment in the Parish Cemetery.

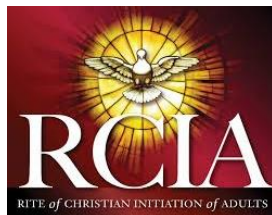



CAFOD: RESPONSE IN GAZA Your donations to Gaza since the start of the conflict have been a vital lifeline. Right now, CAFOD's partner, Caritas Jerusalem, is delivering essential medical treatment to displaced people and providing medicines to treat chronic illnesses. We have helped 1,400 households with cash to buy supplies in the last month and we are currently feeding 2,000 people with new stocks of flour and rice. Despite the restrictions on aid coming into Gaza, CAFOD's local partners are working tirelessly to help people. And with your ongoing support, they will do all in their power to keep doing so.
