THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD (A)

Sunday, 11 January 2026

Spiritual Reflection:

Today the Season of Christmastide draws to a close and reaches a wonderful climax in a definitive event in Jesus' life: his baptism. This was a remarkable event because the baptism offered by John the Baptist was for repentance. The immersion in the waters of the Jordan was a sign of conversion, of a person changing direction in life. John's message was addressed to tax collectors, soldiers and ordinary men and women. It was a message of moral reform, of preparing for the coming of the Messiah. Jesus' baptism began his public life and, in this moment, God is revealed as the Blessed Trinity.



The Trinity is unique to Christianity. We are united to Muslims and Jews because we share a common belief in One God, but at this point our faiths depart sharply from one another because we believe that God is Three Persons in One God: Father, Son & Holy Spirit. Jesus' baptism was the manifestation, the epiphany, of Jesus as the Messiah and the Son of God.

The unveiling of Jesus' nature and mission brought forth from the Father a tender and heart-warming affirmation: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.' Jesus' baptism was the acceptance and inauguration of his Mission as God's Suffering Servant. He allowed himself to be numbered among sinners; he is truly 'the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.'

In today's Gospel we see the 'fulfilling of righteousness.' We are witnesses of Jesus consenting to submit himself entirely to his Father's will, his death on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. The coming down of the Spirit at his baptism looked forward to the Spirit coming down on us - a prelude to the new creation. We commit ourselves to enter more deeply into the mystery of our baptism, praying about it, seeking to understand it and growing in our appreciation of this wonderful grace.

Do you know the date you were baptised? The late Pope St John Paul II believed the day of his baptism was the greatest day of his life. Our initiation into the Christian life commences on the day of our Baptism. In the Gospel today we see Jesus' baptism. It wasn't necessary for him to be baptised as he was free from sin; but he uses it as a witness to those around, how he wishes to be associated with sinful humanity, as Saviour. The sacred promises made by our loving parents on the day of a child's baptism are an eternal legacy to the child, that they will do everything in their power to keep that child on the path of Jesus Christ, and ultimately, leading to God. Baptism is the gateway to the Sacramental Life; we begin that great journey of discovery and live out daily those promises so solemnly made on our behalf. Perhaps, you can look at your Baptismal Certificate today

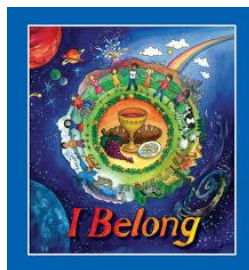

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The Parents' & Children's Meetings will take place on *Saturday, 17th January* commencing with **9.15am** Mass for all. Fr John will talk to the parents after the Mass and the children will disperse into the various groups for the first session. The children's session will end at 11.30am. It is absolutely imperative that all the children attend every session of the First Holy Communion Programme.



As you can appreciate, we only have a limited amount of time with the children at each session. If your child is unable to attend through sickness please contact Fr John personally Tel No: 01277 265 235. They will have to make up the session at a later date.

Also, the Homework Sessions will be emailed to parents. Please ensure you sit down at least once a week with your child, and share with them the homework, and talk to them about their First Holy Communion. The children will be prepared for First Reconciliation throughout Lent. Please ensure that you personally drop off and pick up your child when the session begins and ends. Thank you! Please keep all the children and their families in your prayers over the next several months.

BAPTISMS: If there are parents wishing to have their children baptised at Brentwood Cathedral, could you kindly contact the Parish Office as soon as possible. For first time parents there is a Baptismal Preparation Programme run by Fr Matúš. Baptisms take place on Saturdays at 11.00am & 12Noon, and Sundays at 1.00pm.

The call out charges were extremely expensive, (£360.00) and could have been avoided if baby wipes, nappies and other things were not put down the toilets. Please only flush toilet tissue. PARISH FINANCES: First and foremost, I would like to thank all our parishioners who contribute on a weekly basis to the upkeep of this Cathedral Parish. This is probably one of the biggest parishes in the Diocese of Brentwood. It is not only our parish, but also the Mother Church of the Diocese. Therefore, it has a two-fold function in the


Diocese. All the major diocesan events take place here at the Cathedral. As you can appreciate, the upkeep of the Cathedral and Parish Halls is wholly dependent on your Weekly Offerings. During the winter months November to April, there is a heavy drain on resources because of the various utilities, heating, lighting & water; and as you will know from your own domestic bills these are rising all the time. Thankfully, this year with our wonderful Bazaar result, this helps us to defray the utilities costs. But additional works throughout the parish, substantially affect our weekly

income. At present we are in the process of repairs to the ceiling and outside roof over the old part of the Cathedral. As a grade 2 star listed building, we have had to follow all the necessary legal requirements for works to be completed. In the Parish cemetery, you may have noticed work has been done on some of the trees. Unfortunately, there are several trees by the railings on the Ingrave Road, which are diseased, and we are seeking professional advice about their removal. There have been serious issues with the gas boilers in the Parish Halls. Above the hall we had to have the roof repaired recently, as there were significant leaks. There were potholes in both of our car parks, which have now been repaired. The list goes on and on. All these expenses come from your weekly gift offertory to the parish. Please take into consideration all these things when making your weekly offering.
